GRADUATE TESTING Applicants for the Master of Education degree program, the Sixth-Year Certification program and Master's programs in educational Psychology and special education are required to take the Miller Analogies test. DEADLINE FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS Graduate School students who plan to receive degrees in August should have their final exams--oral, written, Plan A or Plan B--completed by July 11. Questions answered at the Graduate School Office, 431 Administration Building.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS Summer Session students who have not been admitted to attend classes at UMD during the regular academic year may stop at the Admissions Office (101 Administration Building) to process the necessary forms. Prompt action is encouraged to allow ample time for consideration of the application. Attendance in Continuing Education and Extension (evening) classes does not imply admission to regular academic year programs.

GRADUATING SENIORS All currently registered students who plan to complete degree requirements during either the first or second terms are required to submit applications for degree by July 3. Applications may be obtained from and returned to the Registrar's Office.

PREVIOUSLY ENROLLED STUDENTS Students previously enrolled during Fall, 1977, and Winter, 1978, and in good academic standing upon leaving may re-enroll by filling out an "Intent to Re-Enroll" form in the Registrar's Office any time preceding fall registration. Students who were not in good standing upon leaving must submit a petition. Registration cannot occur before the admission process has been completed. (Registrar's Office)

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
