On Tap This Week: Minnesota (8-2) will play host to Iowa State (3-5) at 6 p.m. Wednesday night in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome before kicking off the fourth annual Hormel Foods Baseball Classic against Rutgers Friday night at 6:30 p.m. California, Connecticut, Minnesota and Rutgers will compete in this year's Hormel Classic, which has developed into one of the nation's most respected collegiate baseball tournaments. As many as 53 recent Major Leaguers have played in the prestigious Hormel Classic.

Minnesota Goes 5-2 on Spring Trip: The Golden Gophers brought a 5-2 record home from a 10-day, seven-game trip to San Diego, Calif., including four straight wins to open the trip.

First up was the rain-hampered San Diego Classic. Due to soggy fields in San Diego, Minnesota ended up in Yuma, Ariz., to play No. 12 Washington. The

Fact Box

SUPER START

With its seven-game winning streak to open the season, the Golden Gophers accomplished their best start since 1935. That squad earned the best start in school history, winning nine straight en route to a 17-3 record and the Big Ten championship.

The last time the Golden Gophers opened the season with an 8-2 mark was in 1958 as the team started 12-2 to finish 26-7 overall and take first in the conference. Last year, the Golden Gophers did not get their eighth win until 16 games into the year with a 20-4 win over Chicago State on March 24.

Golden Gophers charged to an early 9-1 lead over the Huskies en route to the 15-9 win. Junior **Craig Selander (West St. Paul, Minn.)** and sophomore **Matt Scanlon (Richfield, Minn.)** led the Golden Gophers with three RBIs each.

The next day, Minnesota overcame a 7-4 deficit to beat the San Diego State Aztecs 10-7 in 10 innings. The Golden Gophers put up two three-run innings to come away with the win. Senior **Mark Groebner (Coon Rapids, Minn.)** broke the tie in the 10th inning with a two-run single.

Rain kept Minnesota from playing its scheduled games against Oregon State and Portland, but the team did get its second win over SDSU with a wild 18-12 victory on Feb. 25. SDSU tied an NCAA Division I record, using 10 relievers in its 18-12 loss.

To end the trip, the Golden Gophers split the series with San Diego 2-2. Minnesota won the first game 3-2 on Feb. 26 and dropped its first two games of the season with a 14-10 loss the next day and a 4-3 decision in 10 innings the next. The Golden Gophers rebounded on the final day of the trip with a decisive 8-3 victory vs. the San Diego Toreros.

About Anderson: In his 17th season at the helm, Golden Gopher Head Coach **John Anderson** holds a career record of 568-371-3 and a Big Ten mark of 233-133. He is one of the youngest coaches in the nation to surpass the 500-win plateau and is the second active Big Ten coach to reach 200 conference victories. Anderson has led the Golden Gophers to four Big Ten titles (1982, 1985, 1988, and 1992) in his tenure at the U of M.

The .300 Club: Twelve of Minnesota's hitters are batting at least .300 this season. Overall, the team is hitting at a .332 clip (126-379) with 77 RBIs. Sophomore **Mike Arlt (Lakeville, Minn.)** leads the team with a scorching .433 average. Junior **Craig Selander (West St. Paul, Minn.)** is the team leader in slugging percentage with a .676 mark. He has six extra-base hits this season, including two home runs.

San Diego Update: On the spring trip to San Diego, the Golden Gophers hit .320 with 87 hits in 272 at-bats. Senior **Mark Groebner (Coon Rapids, Minn.)** led the team hitting a remarkable .591 (13-22) with 11 RBIs while in San Diego. Junior **Matt Brosseau (North Oaks, Minn.)** hit .438 (8-23) on the trip. As a team, the Golden Gophers scored 67 runs, an average of 9.57 per game, compared with only 51, 7.29 runs per game, for their opponents.

Birk Sets Career High with 10 Strikeouts: Sophomore **Ben Birk (St. Paul, Minn.)** set a career high when he fanned 10 batters in Minnesota's win over Nebraska Feb. 15, surpassing his previous high of nine set in a 7-5 loss to Mankato State last year (April 30) at Siebert Field. The left-hander earned his first collegiate victory in Minnesota's 15-9 win vs. Washington and leads the team with 20 strikeouts in three appearances.

Minnesota with the Bat: The Golden Gophers have knocked in a grand total of 90 runs this season for an average of 9.0 runs per game. Last year through 10 games, the team had only scored

47 runs. This season, Minnesota's opponents have scored 62 runs, an average of 6.2 per contest.

Sophomore **Matt Scanlon (Richfield, Minn.)** is the early-season leader with 13 RBIs. Selander and Groebner have each knocked in 12 RBIs on the year.

Scouting Iowa State: The Iowa State Cyclones enter Wednesday night's game with a 3-5 record, including a 2-4 record on the road. The team will face Minnesota before opening the Big 12 schedule with three games with No. 5 Oklahoma over the weekend. In the series between these two teams, Minnesota holds a 69-25 advantage. The Golden Gophers won both games with the Cyclones last year, a 6-5 victory on March 5 at the Metrodome and 18-6 on April 15 in Ames, Iowa.

Senior first baseman Shawn Leimbek, the brother of Minnesota freshman hockey player Matt Leimbek, is the leader with a .345 batting average. Senior Shawn Sedlacek has emerged as the No. 1 starter with an 0-1 record and a 4.91 ERA. He has 11 strikeouts in 11.0 innings pitched.

Scouting the Hormel Classic: Rutgers enters the Hormel Classic with a 1-2 record after the team's season-opening series with Old Dominion. ODU won the first two games, but Rutgers took the third contest, a 13-11 decision in 10 innings. Starring for the Scarlet Knights, who return 25 letterwinners this season, is All-Big East first baseman Pete Zoccodillo. He led the team in six offensive categories last year and went 6 for 15 with three RBIs in last weekend's series with Old Dominion. In all, Rutgers is loaded with experienced players with the return of its entire infield, outfield and four conference starters and several key relievers from its pitching staff last year. That team finished second in the Big East's National Division.

Connecticut opens its season at the prestigious Hormel Classic this year. The 1998 season looks promising for UConn, which returns all four starting pitchers and the core of its team. The team has added 11 newcomers to its team which features 15 returning letterwinners. Outfielder and co-captain Billy Rich returns as the main offensive threats after posting one of the finest seasons ever for a UConn player. A first-team All-Big East selection last year, he led the team in average, hits, doubles and total bases one season ago. On the mound, junior left-hander Josh Santos has emerged as the ace with a multi-pitch arsenal.

California has had a rocky start and holds a 3-11-1 record, with a game scheduled with Sacramento State on Wednesday. The Golden Bears feature two players, shortstop Brian Oliver and catcher Jason Hill, who were members of the 1997 USA National team and two others who were invited to the November tryouts in reliever Jon Cuccias and second baseman Xavier Nady. Oliver is leading the team with a .352 batting average. Hill is the early-season leader with 16 RBIs, including five home runs and 10 total extra-base hits, and Nady is just behind with 15 RBIs. So far this season, sophomore right-hander Jon Shirley has seen the most action on the hill, pitching 26.1 innings in five starts. He holds an 0-3 record and a 3.42 ERA while striking out 21 batters in those appearances.

Minnesota vs. Hormel Classic Foes: The Golden Gophers have

played the teams featured in the Hormel Classic just seven times in the past.

Minnesota holds a 2-0 edge in the series with its first opponent, the Rutgers Scarlet Knights. The Maroon and Gold defeated the team 8-7 in the last meeting, March 21, 1991 in Miami, Fla. In the only other meeting between these two teams, a 36-7 victory on March 18, Minnesota set a modern-day school record for runs. The school record was 39 scored in a 91-39 loss to the St. Paul Saxons in 1876, the first year of the school's program. It is unclear how that 1876 game was scored.

Connecticut won the only meeting with Minnesota. The Huskies defeated the Golden Gophers 8-6 at the Metrodome on March 1, 1996.

California holds a 3-1 edge over Minnesota. Saturday afternoon's game will mark the first meeting between the two teams in 57 years. Minnesota picked up an 8-7 victory in the last meeting which occurred May 26, 1941 in Minneapolis.

Records Watch: Junior All-America candidate **Robb Quinlan (Maplewood, Minn.)** is poised to climb to the top of Minnesota's record book for career doubles. With his school single-season record of 29 doubles last year and three on Minnesota's trip to San Diego, he moved into sixth place, just four two-baggers away from Tony Bender and Jeff Monson, who each had 45 during their careers at the U of M.

Extra Innings: Already this season, the Golden Gophers have gone into extra innings three times with a 2-1 record. Last year, the team played three total extra innings games, coming away with losses in all three affairs.

Comeback Kids: Minnesota has come from behind in four games so far this year. Most recently the team was down 2-1 to San Diego in the third inning before coming back to win 3-2 on Feb. 26. The largest deficit Minnesota has overcome was five runs on Feb. 25 when it trailed San Diego State 11-6 heading into the sixth inning. Minnesota posted six runs in its half of the sixth inning to take the lead en route to a 18-12 victory.

1997 Review: The Golden Gophers finished with a 30-24 overall record for their 35th consecutive winning season and took fifth in the Big Ten with a 15-10 mark. The team finished strong, winning seven of its final eight games.

Senior pitcher **Mike Diebolt**, who set the single-season strikeout record previously held by Dave Winfield, was named first-team All-Big Ten along with outfielder **Robb Quinlan**, who set the single-season mark with 29 doubles.

Infielder **Eric Welter** and pitchers **Ted Zrust** and **Justin Pederson** were honored on the third-team All-Big Ten squad. A total of nine letterwinners, including Quinlan and six position starters, return to the 1998 team.

Who's Back: Despite losing the services of 11 seniors to graduation, Minnesota returns nine letterwinners with considerable experience. Junior outfielder **Robb Quinlan** highlights the group of returners. A first-team All-Big Ten selection, Quinlan set the single-season school mark with 29 doubles last year. Other experienced returners include senior center fielder **Mark Groebner (Coon Rapids, Minn.)**, junior right fielder **Craig Selander (West St. Paul, Minn.)**, sophomore third baseman **Matt Scanlon**, sophomore shortstop **Mark Devore** and junior second baseman **Matt Brosseau**.

On the Mound: Minnesota's pitching staff will be characterized by its improvement and increased depth from one season ago. Leading the group will be sophomore left-hander **Ben Birk** who emerged from fall workouts as the No. 1 starter. Rounding out the probable starting rotation are senior right-hander **Jason Dobis (Little Falls, Minn.)** and junior right-handers **Kai Freeman** and **Brad Pautz**.

Minnesota Baseball to Honor Coach "Ike": The Golden Gophers honored a special part of Minnesota's baseball tradition at this year's Pro-Alumni Game when the team retired the jersey of longtime volunteer assistant coach Herb "Ike" Isakson. Isakson, who retired from active coaching following last season, dedicated 34 years to the Golden Gopher baseball team as a volunteer coach. An honorary "M" letterwinner, Isakson also received the Men's Athletics Distinguished Service award. Later this season, his number will be hung on the walls of Siebert Field, joining the numbers of Paul Molitor, Dave Winfield, Dave Chelesnik and Dick Siebert.

The Program: The Golden Gopher baseball program is one filled with a history of success and pride. Among the facts:

- 83 winning seasons
- 35 consecutive winning seasons
- Only five losing seasons in the last 63 years
- 17 Big Ten Championships, 15 in the last 42 seasons
- 21 NCAA appearances
- Five College World Series appearances
- Three NCAA titles

Professionally Speaking: Six former Golden Gophers are currently members of Major League rosters. Minnesota's current

Major Leaguers include Minnesota Twins Paul Molitor, Terry Steinbach and Brent Gates, Atlanta Braves Denny Neagle and Kerry Ligtenberg and Seattle Mariner Dan Wilson. In addition, Brian Raabe is playing on a major league roster in Japan.

Home Field, Dome Field Advantage: Minnesota will play 29 home games this season with 17 at the Metrodome (home of the Minnesota Twins), including the Golden Gophers' Big Ten opener vs. Purdue, March 27-29. In the month of March, Minnesota will play all 14 of its games in the Metrodome. The other 12 home games will be played at Siebert Field, Minnesota's on-campus home.

KKMS-AM (980) and Midwest Sports Channel to Broadcast Games in 1998: The University of Minnesota announced that KKMS-AM (980) will broadcast 40 games, including all of Minnesota's Big Ten Conference games. Paul Barnes will be entering his third year as the radio voice of the Golden Gophers.

Midwest Sports Channel will televise four games beginning with the Connecticut vs. Minnesota game in the Hormel Foods Baseball Classic March 8. Other games on MSC include the March 29 matchup with Purdue, the first game of the doubleheader with Iowa on April 4 and the first game of the April 25 doubleheader with Indiana. Former Golden Gopher center fielder Ryan Lefebvre will handle the broadcast duties for MSC.
