

DULUTH -- The annual meeting of Region 10, American College Unions-International will take place Thursday, Friday and Saturday (Nov. 4, 5, 6) on the University of Minnesota, Duluth (UMD) campus.

Regional Chairman Tom Dock, a UMD student from Duluth, reports that approximately 200 students from member schools in Iowa, North and South Dakota and Minnesota will attend.

The three-day round of conferences and workshops opens with registration from 4-6 p.m. Thursday. Friday will be devoted to various aspects of student union operations. A business meeting is scheduled for Saturday morning.

C. Shaw Smith, Director of Student Activities and the Student Union at Davidson College, Davidson, North Carolina, will deliver the keynote address at 7:30 p.m. Thursday in Kirby Student Center ballroom. His remarks will concern the theme of the conference, "Union Within Diversity."

UMD Provost R. W. Darland and Judy Pettersen, regional vice-chairman from Macalester College in St. Paul, will deliver welcoming speeches before the opening session. Dock will be master of ceremonies.

The ACU-I members meet each year to discuss the cultural, social, recreational and educational programs provided by college unions and seeks ways and means of improving them.

The ACU-I was founded in 1914 and today its membership includes 556 campus unions or student centers throughout the world. A Canadian institution, Lakehead College of Port Arthur, Ont., will send observers to the UMD meeting with plans of joining the ACU-I.
