DULUTH--Two audio-visual courses that have been in heavy demand will be offered during the first UMD Summer Session term June 17--July 20 under controlled enrollments.

Douglas Hed, director of audio-visual instruction in the Edina-Morningside school district, will teach courses in Radio and Television in Education and Audio-Visual Materials and Equipment Laboratory.

Both are three-credit courses tentatively scheduled for Room 165, Physical Education building Monday through Friday.

The audio-visual laboratory course will meet at 8 a.m. It will cover the preparation and presentation of motion pictures, slides, etc. and is open to a limited number of audio-visual coordinators and students needing the course for audio-visual certification.

The education TV course will meet at 2 p.m. and cover the utilization of radio and television in classroom instruction.

"This course was requested by the Duluth Board of Education to better train teachers within the school system for educational television," according to Dr. Ward Wells, head of the Department of Physical Education for Men.

Dr. Wells explained that course reservations should be sent to him in advance of the opening of the first term of summer session.
