MATRIX TO DEBUT--"Matrix, a 13-week, half-hour television series about the University of Minnesota, will be seen at 9:30 a.m. Sundays on KDLH-TV Channel 3, beginning April 13. Each show will be repeated at 8:30 p.m. Thursdays on WDSE-TV Channel 8. Peter Graves, star of the network television series "Mission: Impossible" and a University alumnus, will introduce the stories on each show which will feature students and faculty, areas of study, research and service, and programs which help people with special needs. Graves will host the first six shows and David Winfield, San Diego Padres outfielder and also an alumnus, will host the remaining seven shows. Topics relating to UMD to be included on the series cover Glensheen, the hypothermia research at the School of Medicine and the Small Business Institute community service project in the School of Business and Economics.

HUMANISTIC EDUCATION AND ITS LESSONS--That's the title of the spring quarter Thea Johnson lecture at 10 a.m. Monday (April 14) in the Marshall Performing Arts Center. Dr. Paul Kristeller, professor emeritus of philosophy at Columbia University, will be the speaker. There also will be an open colloquium with Kristeller at 1:30 p.m. in the Tweed Lecture Gallery. Both events are free and open to the public.

Building) between the Minnesota Vikings and a team of UMD faculty, local broadcasters and high school coaches, also are planned for that evening to raise money.
