SPRING QUARTER FEES

1. Spring quarter fee statements are being mailed to all students now registered at the University. March 18 is the last date on which payment will be accepted without penalty. The penalty for late payment is \$2.00 until March 29, and on that date increases at the rate of \$1.00 per day until fees are paid. Students who must write home for money or make loans are urged to complete such arrangements within the specified time.

2. All checks, drafts and money orders should be made payable to The University of Minnesota, and should be accompanied by all three sections of the fee statement. In remitting by mail, the Bursar's envelope received with the fee statement should be used.

3. Remittances must be for the exact amount of the fee statement. The Bursar cannot accept checks, drafts or money orders for an amount in excess of the fee statement. In-

sufficient remittances will be returned to the student at his own risk. The student's registration will remain incomplete until his fees are paid in full.

4. Failure to receive a fee statement cannot be accepted as sufficient reason for late payment or non-payment of fees. Any student who does not receive a fee statement in his University post-office box within a reasonable time after March 1 may secure a duplicate fee statement at the Registrar's office. Students whose work takes them from the campus must inform the Registrar's office promptly of change of address.

5. Students using "War Service" tuition, trainees of the U. S. Veterans' Bureau, and of the State Division of Re-education, Foreign Government students, and beneficiaries of the scholarship funds of miscellaneous wartime agencies must secure the written approval of the Assistant Registrar on their fee statements and present them to the Bursar within the above time limit in order to avoid penalty for late payment.

NOTICE OF SPRING QUARTER REGISTRATION

College of Science, Literature, and the Arts. Juniors and Seniors who have not registered for the spring quarter must register before Saturday noon, in the office of the Assistant Dean for the Senior College, 221 Folwell Hall. Necessary changes in registration for those who have already registered for the spring quarter will be made during the same period.

Unclassed students in the College of Science, Literature, and the Arts may register March 7, 8, and 9. Blanks may be secured in the office of Mr. Shumway, 119 Folwell Hall.

College of Engineering and Architecture. Students in the College of Engineering and Architecture who have not filled out their schedule blanks for the spring quarter must do so on March 28. Students who have already filled out their schedule blanks must complete their registration by presenting their fee statement and receiving their schedule blanks on March 28. All necessary changes in registration must be made on that date.

Registration and change of registration will take place in the Main Engineering Building in rooms announced on the Bulletin Board.

College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Home Economics. All students registered in the College this quarter must complete their registration by March 18th. New students will register from March 23 to 28.

Medical School. Students in the Medical School who have not already registered for the spring quarter must do so March 20 or 21 in Room 118, Millard Hall.

College of Dentistry. Students in the College of Dentistry must register for the spring quarter between March 20 and 22, inclusive. Necessary changes in registration must be made on March 27 or 28. Registration and change of registration will take place in the office of the Dean, 103 Dentistry Bldg.

School of Mines. Students in the School of Mines must register for the spring quarter on March 16th or 17th. Necessary changes in registration must be made on March 28th. Registration and change of registration will take place in the office of the Dean, 103 Mines building.
