DULUTH -- A half-hour program explaining UMD's New Student Orientation/Registration procedures will be broadcast at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday (August 24) over WDSM-TV as a public affairs presentation of that station.

WDSM's Ted O'Brien will moderate the program and a panel which will include Provost Raymond W. Darland; Dr. Chester W. Wood, professor and director of Student Personnel Services; Edwin O. Siggelkow, coordinator of student activities and Kirby Student Center; and Donald Streufert of Minneapolis, new student orientation commissioner.

"The program will give prospective students an insight into the process by which they are oriented and registered for classes during their first quarter at UMD," said Siggelkow.

"Also, it will show how the introduction to college is personalized through small orientation groups and how select upperclass students are used to carry out a large part of the program."

A short film clip will follow two incoming freshmen Sandy Knutson of Hermantown and Jeffrey Wells of Duluth through a typical two days of orientation and registration with an upperclass sponsor, Tyler Gill of Virginia.

Orientation/registration begins August 29 and continues through September 16. Freshman Camp will be held September 16-18 with Welcome Week scheduled September 20-23.
