Duluth--- Dr. Marvin Pabin, conductor of the Wisconsin Youth Symphony Orchestra, will be guest clinician for the ninth annual UMD String Clinic on Friday in Kirby Student Center Ballroom.

Participating at the clinic will be 120 high school musicians from Duluth and surrounding area schools. They will rehearse all day and give a public concert at 7:30 p.m. in the Ballroom.

Rabin will conduct the orchestra in the evening concert.

A chamber orchestra within the full string orchestra will be a new addition to the evening concert this year. The chamber group will perform two special numbers.

Top musicians in their respective high school orchestras, the students have been specially selected to attend the clinic. They will rehearse under Dr. Rabin from 9 to 11 a.m. and from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. on Friday. They come from grades 9 through 12.

Numbers for the concert will include 'Capriol Suite, by Warlock, 'Two Folk Songs' by G. McKay, 'Divertimento for Strings' by Verrall, 'Adventures in Strings' by Bornoff-Budesheim, 'Air and Rondo' by Purcell-Rowley, 'Festival Music for Strings' by Schroeder, 'Waltz from Serenade for Strings' by Tchaikowsky-Perry and 'Air and Bouree' by Bach-Carse.

Duluth schools participating in the clinic are Woodland Junior, West Junior, Washington Junior, Lincoln Junior and East, Denfeld and Central High Schools.

Area schools include Silver Bay, Proctor Junior and Senior High, International Falls, Gilbert, Eveleth, Cloquet, Chisholm, and Aurora.
