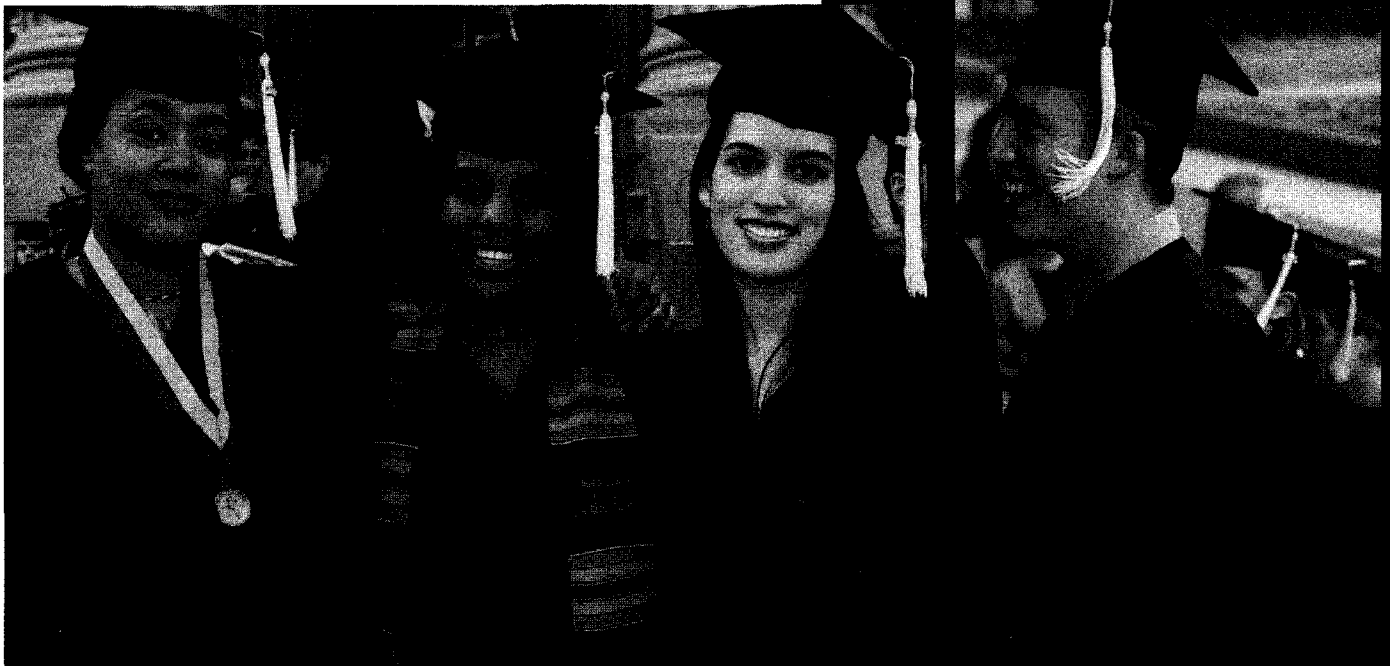



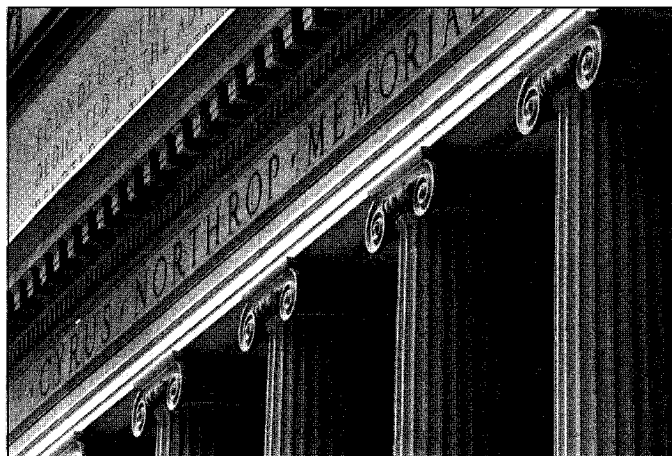
...world-class education for the 21st century

The University of Minnesota, ranked among the nation's top public universities, reflects the state of Minnesota's strong and enduring commitment to education. It is nearly unique among universities in the United States in its three defining characteristics:

- It is an esteemed international research university.
- It is a public land-grant institution with a strong tradition of education and public service.
- Its largest campus—the Twin Cities campus—is located in a vibrant metropolitan area with not one, but two, great cities at its center: Minneapolis and St. Paul.

The University is the primary center in Minnesota (and much of the Upper Midwest) for education and research in the liberal arts and sciences, health sciences, law, education, engineering, agriculture, and natural resources. The Twin Cities campus comprises 19 colleges and offers a full range of academic and professional degrees. A comprehensive campus in Duluth offers undergraduate and graduate programs. The Morris campus offers a four-year liberal arts program. Crookston offers associate and baccalaureate degrees in technical, career-oriented programs. Through the Minnesota Extension Service, the University is present in each of Minnesota's 87 counties.

When the University was founded as a preparatory school in 1851, Minnesota had been a territory for just two years, and statehood was still seven years away. The



school was built on little more than the pioneers' faith in education. In its early years, the University struggled financially; during the Civil War, it was forced to close. It reopened in 1867, thanks to the energetic leadership of Governor John S. Pillsbury, who came

to be known as the "Father of the University." Mathematics Professor William Watts Folwell became the University's first president in 1869. Robert Bruininks is the University's fifteenth president.

Two students received bachelor of arts degrees at the first commencement in June 1873. Since then, the University has granted more than 550,000 degrees.

University alumni include five Nobel Prize winners, a former chief justice of the United States Supreme Court, two former U.S. vice presidents, the heads of Fortune 500 companies, pioneers in medicine, civil rights leaders, top journalists, distinguished teachers and scholars, performing artists, and countless other men and women who have achieved distinction in every field.

Alumni and their families and friends are always welcome at the University. We invite you to visit campus regularly to enjoy the many educational, cultural, and entertainment opportunities that are open to the public—including performances by students in CLA's vibrant arts programs. We also invite you to continue your relationship with the University through the University of Minnesota Alumni Association and the CLA Alumni Society.

THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

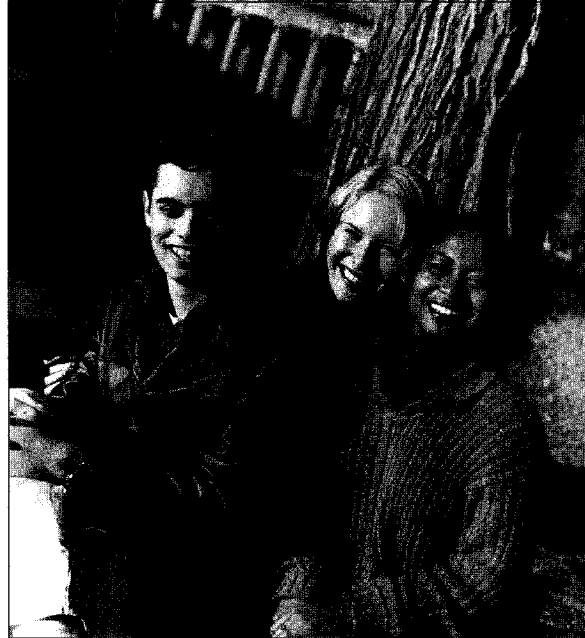
... creating the future for 135 years

The College of Liberal Arts (CLA)—then the College of Science, Literature and Arts (SLA)—offered its first classes at the University of Minnesota in 1869, 18 years after the founding of the University. Since then, it has become an international center for education in the arts and sciences, humanities, and social sciences.

The liberal arts span all areas of human knowledge, enterprise, and aspirations. The college offers more than 60 majors, with study and research opportunities in fields ranging from art to anthropology, from world languages and cultures to world history, from global economic systems to neuroscience. Students whose interests cross disciplines may design individualized major programs—an option that has grown in popularity in recent years as knowledge sets and career preparation requirements become increasingly fluid.

The majority of students who enter CLA as first-year students complete their undergraduate education in CLA. Others complete their basic liberal arts coursework in the college and then transfer to other units of the University. The college offers strong preprofessional programs with close ties to the health sciences and other professional schools at the University.

There are more than 16,700 undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in CLA programs. Approxi-



mately 540 permanent faculty members—teachers and scholars of international stature—share with students their vast knowledge, their provocative insights, and the most current research in their fields.

CLA students acquire both breadth of knowledge and particular depth and proficiency in a specialized field of knowledge. Whatever their majors, students complete an education based broadly in the liberal arts.

Courses necessary to meet general education requirements introduce students to modes of inquiry and subject matter across the major branches of knowledge.

This education is the very best preparation for lives and careers in a rapidly changing world. CLA graduates develop a solid grounding in ideas and knowledge across disciplines, across centuries, across cultures, and across geographic boundaries, as well as proficiency in critical analysis, communication, and research methodologies.

Equipped with this education, graduates of the College of Liberal Arts bring into the world the communication skills, critical and innovative thinking, creativity, and intellectual versatility needed for a lifetime of learning, leadership, and success.

MICHELE NORRIS

HOST, "ALL THINGS CONSIDERED," NATIONAL PUBLIC RADIO

Keynote Speaker

Michele Norris, an award-winning journalist with nearly two decades of experience, hosts "All Things Considered," public radio's longest-running national program, with Robert Siegel and Melissa Block. She began hosting the program on December 9, 2002.

Before coming to National Public Radio, Norris was a correspondent for ABC News, a post she held from 1993 to 2002. As a contributing correspondent for the "Closer Look" segments on "World News Tonight" with Peter Jennings, Norris reported extensively on education, inner city issues, the nation's drug problems, and poverty. Norris has also reported for the *Washington Post*, *Chicago Tribune*, and *Los Angeles Times*.



A four-time Pulitzer Prize entrant, Norris has received numerous awards for her work, including the 1989 Livingston Award, the 1990 Chesapeake Associated Press News Executive's Council Editorial Contest Award for Feature Writing, and the 1990 Federal Bar Association Media Award. Norris's series on a six-year-old who lived in a crack house was reprinted in the book *Ourselves Among Others*.

Norris attended the University of Wisconsin, where she majored in electrical engineering, and the University of Minnesota, where she majored in journalism in the School of Journalism and Mass Communication. She is married, has two children, and lives in Washington, D.C.

MICHAEL DENNIS BROWNE

HORACE T. MORSE—UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA ALUMNI AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS TO UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION

English professor and poet Michael Dennis Browne is revered by students and colleagues alike for his deep commitment to his craft. He also is known for his dedication to students. His outstanding contributions to the teaching and practice of creative writing have made him a shining light in the field, locally and nationally.

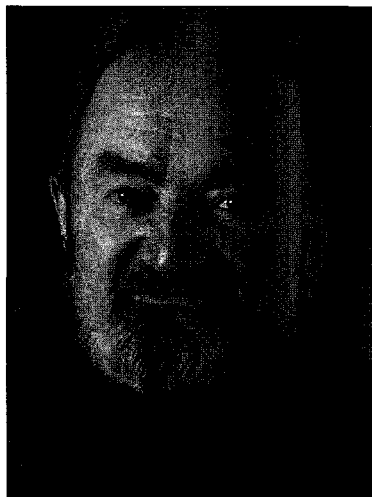
In recognition of his dedication to students, he has received not only the Morse-Alumni Award but also teaching awards from CLA and the College of Continuing Education.

"I think students can tell that I love what I do and I love language," Browne says. "Saul Bellow said that a writer is a reader moved to emulation ... You read something and you want to do that, too. So if I communicate my delight in what I do, that's infectious."

Browne's contributions to the local writing scene have been numerous and significant. Among them, he was a founding member of the Loft Literary Center and a former director of the University's Creative Writing Program. He enjoys writing for music and the collaboration it entails, calling it his second love.

Born into a musical family in Walton-on-Thames in Surrey, England, Browne arrived in America some 40 years ago as a young graduate-student poet at the University of Iowa. He received his master of arts in literature and, in 1971, began teaching at the University of Minnesota. He never guessed he'd stay, but he found his niche and fell in love with the north woods.

"In the early sixties, I read these James Wright poems and I adored them," says Browne. "When I was at Iowa, I visited northern Minnesota, where James Wright used to go with [poet] Robert Bly, his old friend. And now [our family has] a cabin there. I love Minnesota. It's been a good home to me. And I've tried to serve it as a teacher and writer."



Browne had received his B.A. in languages (French and Swedish) from Hull University in England, followed by a year at Oxford. His Catholic high school teachers instilled in him their love of languages, which he now passes on to his students. But in the beginning, Browne didn't think he would ever teach.

"I thought I'd be an actor," he says in a voice accented in what he calls 'Anglo-Sotan.' "When I came to Iowa, I was in plays my first year. Then I thought I really wanted to be the person who puts the words in the mouths."

Browne employs his theatrical sensibilities reading around the country and in the classroom, where he insists on playfulness and humanness—without which, he says, information is dead. "Each class is a human occasion," he says, "and that must have an improvisational quality that includes elements of play."

Browne says he owes his success as a teacher to rapport he develops with students through empathy and listening skills. With two children in college and another in high school, he's especially tuned in to students these days.

"It's a question of knowing what it might be like to be them ... and part of the art is really listening to what they're saying and what they're unable to say, and picking up on that," he says. "There's a majority of people who, if they feel that they're being listened to, can really open up with that kind of attention. And a lot of them have never had that kind of attention paid to them."

Graduating senior Nell Kromhout says it's an honor to have studied with Browne: "Michael nurtures the inner inquisitive mind in his students by a continuous yet gentle challenge of our comfort levels as poets and as people."

Browne considers himself fortunate, too.

"It's like a garden—you see things grow and bloom," he says. "There are before-and-after stories of students over the years that are just lovely. And many become friends."

HORACE T. MORSE—UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA ALUMNI AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS TO UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION

Department of Psychology

An honors psychology student made a big difference for a local family a few years ago when she helped an 11-year-old child with autism break a lifelong habit of bed-wetting.

The student owes her magic to psychology professor and behavioral psychologist Gail Peterson, an award-winning teacher whose undergraduate courses—including his service-learning courses—continue to win accolades as they prepare students to practice behavior therapies.

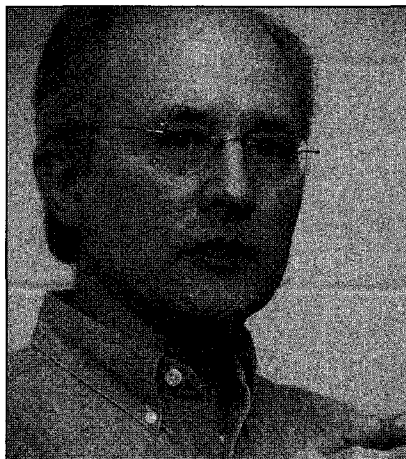
Following two semesters of classroom work in the courses, students provide supervised behavioral interventions in the home of a child with autism. They learn how to teach the child functional language and social skills, including how to shed the repetitive-motion behaviors often associated with autism.

Students are placed in homes by service agencies, chiefly the Minnesota Autism Center and the Lovaas Institute For Early Intervention. Many students, says Peterson, go on to be employed by these agencies.

“There’s a great need for qualified people to provide early intensive behavior therapy to children with developmental delays, including autism,” says honors psychology student Bassim Birkland.

“[Peterson’s] classes give you a taste of what it’s like to assess people and provide therapy. It confirms in us that we have chosen the right career path.”

“Children resonate with these nice young people more than with an old fogey like me,” says Peterson, who, 60, has been on the psychology faculty at the U for more than 30 years. But with several generations of grateful alumni to his credit, he is, by all accounts, no fogey. He continues his research unabated, while devoting himself unreservedly to his students—whose repertoire of accolades includes words like “phenomenal,” “generous,” “delightful,” and “inspirational.”



Decidedly and emphatically a behaviorist in a department long considered a leader in behavior research and therapy, Peterson focuses on environmental interventions that reshape behavior. Because the brain is “plastic,” it can be reengineered, in a fashion, through behavioral interactions with the environment, he says. He sees neuroscience and brain imaging as discovering the exact nature of the underlying brain mechanisms.

“Neuroscience has confirmed that behavioral activity of the kind induced by behavior therapists has an impact on the physical structure and organization of the brain,” says Peterson. This is “not surprising,” he adds. “We [behaviorists] have assumed all along that must be the case.”

“All behavior is a product of the nervous system, and therefore when behavior changes dramatically, it follows that there must have been a change of some kind in the nervous system. Neuroscience aims to tell us exactly what that is.”

If there’s a teaching mechanism hard-wired into the brain, Peterson has put that circuitry to admirable use. Not one to seek glory, he has found himself in the limelight nonetheless as a great teacher and mentor. He not only has received this year’s Morse-Alumni Award for Outstanding Contribution to Undergraduate Education but also has been lauded repeatedly as one of the psychology department’s most gifted, most engaged teachers.

A colleague says, “Gail is one of the most committed, gifted, expert, and humane educators at the University. No one has been more noble and generous than Gail. His unflagging work ethic, expertise, wisdom, and compassion *humble* me ... and *inspire* me to care more and to do better, to live a good life as I engage the world.”

ARTHUR "RED" AND HELENE B. MOTLEY OUTSTANDING TEACHING AWARD

Department of Speech-Language-Hearing Sciences



Newspapers are filled with reports of poor performance and high dropout rates in the America's increasingly diverse schools, especially in places like the Twin Cities, whose culture has been transformed by waves of immigration. Kathryn Kohnert wants to turn those statistics on their heads. Her view is that if something isn't working, it can be fixed—with some know-how, basic research, and canny, culturally unbiased rethinking of the problem.

While working as a speech-language pathologist for bilingual children and adults in San Diego, Calif., in the early 1990s, Kohnert found she had questions that were not being addressed in research about how to diagnose language disorders in bilingual speakers. So she decided to study the cognitive underpinnings of language in typical second-language learners and also in monolingual children with language disorders.

With her Ph.D. in hand, she set out to discover new ways to diagnose language disorders and train the next generation of speech pathologists, hoping ultimately to have an impact on performance in the schools, where the results of her research really take root. Little did she know that she would become a national leader in cognitive research on language development in bilingual speakers.

A Minnesota transformed by recent immigration has become a living laboratory for Kohnert's research. At a local preschool, she works to identify children who might have language disorders. And in off-campus workshops, she teaches primarily Spanish-speaking parents how to foster language development in their bilingual children.

In her classrooms, where she is teaching the next generation of educators and speech pathologists, Kohnert stresses the importance of recognizing diversity within a broad language-learning framework—understanding normal variation across cultures, languages, ages, and abilities.

The traditional language assessment model reflects the biases of the dominant culture of native English speakers, Kohnert says. Her aim is to identify and develop less biased ways to assess language and learning—and to help her students do likewise. She is especially concerned about the number of bilingual children who are either over- or under-identified for communication disorders. Learning differences in linguistically and culturally diverse populations of children may be just that—differences, and

not problems. A perceived lag or measured "deficiency" or anomaly in vocabulary, grammar, or pronunciation does not mean a disorder. But to treat it as such can be damaging to the child.

Only careful diagnostic assessment using culturally sensitive methods and benchmarks can establish the presence or absence of a bona fide learning problem, says Kohnert, who hopes to discover "ways to intervene to maximize each child's learning ability while respecting their diverse experiences."

Each day, Kohnert's work takes her one step closer to the language assessment tools she diligently seeks. And she takes her enthusiastic students with her on the journey. Her work has been acclaimed not just by admiring students but also by her colleagues across the University. Her groundbreaking research earned her a 2003 McKnight Land-Grant Professorship, which recognizes junior faculty whose work demonstrates "originality, imagination, and innovation" and demonstrates "potential to make significant contributions to their disciplines."

"No other professor ... has this unique teaching style, openness, insights, and warmth," says a student. "Dr. Kohnert is a passionate professor and my role model. She has influenced my life not only academically but also personally." Says another, "Kathy Kohnert showed me how much a person could accomplish with hard work, courage, and a good heart."

LIBERAL ARTS DEGREES

The College of Liberal Arts offers five bachelor's degrees—bachelor of arts (B.A.), bachelor of individualized studies (B.I.S.), bachelor of fine arts (B.F.A.), bachelor of music (B.M.), and bachelor of science (B.S.). The bachelor's degrees have many requirements in common.

DEGREE CANDIDATES

Subject to successful completion, degrees will be conferred on those students listed below and on others meeting all curriculum requirements for graduation. Honor citations are provisional and do not become final until all requirements are met for the level indicated. Degrees and degree candidates are listed alphabetically in this program.

HONORS DESIGNATIONS—Honors graduates complete college and departmental honors requirements, including completing honors projects in their majors, with a minimum G.P.A. of 3.5 for the last 60 credits of their undergraduate career. Students meeting these minimum requirements may graduate *cum laude*. Students graduating *magna cum laude* have a minimum G.P.A. of 3.66. Students graduating *summa cum laude* have a minimum G.P.A. of 3.75 and have completed a summa thesis that has been approved by three readers, one of whom is outside the discipline of the major.

DEGREES WITH DISTINCTION—Students graduating “with distinction” must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.75 or higher in University of Minnesota coursework at the time of graduation; students graduating “with high distinction” must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.90 or higher. At least 60 of the total number of semester credits must have been completed at the University of Minnesota. * indicates “with distinction”; ** indicates “with high distinction.”

THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS

This degree can be earned through majors in most CLA departments and programs. Its breadth and diversity in general education make it valuable as a base for many kinds of careers or for advanced study. CLA offers several professional majors and specializations as well as interdepartmental programs for the B.A. degree.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

Academic gowns date back to the 14th century, when they served two functions of nearly equal importance: to indicate the academic rank of the wearer and to keep the scholar warm in the drafty stone halls of academia.

The markings, cut, and color of modern-day academic costume—cap, gown, and sometimes hood—indicate the academic degree, the field of study, and the institution that granted the degree.

Bachelor's degree gowns are black and untrimmed. A tassel hanging from the mortar board worn on the head is color-coded by college at the University of Minnesota. The College of Liberal Arts tassel is white. Honors graduates wear a medallion adorned with a maroon and gold ribbon.

Master's degree gowns, black and untrimmed, have pointed sleeves. Doctoral gowns in the United States traditionally have been black with velvet front facings and crossbars on the sleeves, but in recent years a number of universities have adopted gowns of distinctive school colors.

A new University of Minnesota Ph.D. gown and matching tam made their appearance in 1988 to celebrate the centenary of the first Minnesota doctor of philosophy degree. The new Minnesota gown is maroon-trimmed with black velvet chevrons and gold metallic braid. The traditional gown may still be worn.

The Minnesota hood, which may be worn by anyone with a doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota, is black with maroon chevron on gold. Each institution has its own pattern of colors on the hood, worn around the neck and down the back of the gown. The length and shape of the hood identify the most advanced degree the wearer has earned, and the velvet edging shows the field: blue for doctor of philosophy, light blue for doctor of education, and pink for doctor of musical arts.

At commencement ceremonies those who already have the doctoral degree wear hoods. Degree candidates wear the gowns appropriate for the degrees they are about to receive, and new doctorates are hooded on stage.

THE MACE

The University of Minnesota mace was carried for the first time in 1961 by Regents' Professor of Physics Alfred O.C. Nier at the inauguration of President O. Meredith Wilson. Art professor Philip Morton designed the mace: a crystal sphere four inches in diameter surmounted by the North Star, symbol of the state of Minnesota, on a solid aluminum handle set with the University regents' seal.

THE NORTHPROP ORGAN

Comprising 108 ranks of pipes, the Northrop Memorial Auditorium organ is not only one of the largest organs in the Upper Midwest but also one of the finest examples in the United States of a late-Romanic concert-hall organ. Built in 1932, the organ is located in the ceiling of the auditorium, above the stage and behind the proscenium, and is played from a console on an elevator platform in the orchestra pit. Unlike many large organs from its era, the Northrop organ is completely unaltered and entirely in its original condition.
