

DULUTH--Works by 11 contemporary artists are included in an exhibition in UMD's Kirby Student center through loan arrangement with the Solomon R. Guggenheim museum in New York.

Under direction of Edwin O. Siggelkow, Kirby Student center and student activities coordinator, and Orazio Fumagalli, Tweed gallery curator, the paintings have been hung in Kirby main lounge. They will remain through February.

Artists represented include Bertoia, Campendonk, Chagall, Domela, Gleizes, Kandinsky, Klee, Leger, Marc, Metzinger and Moholy-Nagy.

The UMD show is one of fifteen groups of paintings sent by the museum to educational institutions in Arizona, California, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia.

The exhibitions have been sent out in accordance with museum trustees' plans to maintain a series of long-term loans to areas where good examples of contemporary art by pioneering artists of the 20th century are not readily available to the public, Siggelkow said.

Long-term loans, they feel, will have more educational value than the brief showings frequently afforded by traveling shows. The community is thus given a longer chance to familiarize itself with the paintings and the artists' style.
