Duluth--- A reception honoring W. Dean Warnholtz, chairman of the Department of Art at Carleton College, Northfield, will be held at 8 p.m. Thursday (Oct. 19) at UMD's Tweed Gallery.

Warnholtz will speak on "Contemporary Prints-Lithography" and an exhibition of his prints will be shown on the balcony of the gallery.

Refreshments will be served at the reception which is open to the public.

Warnholtz, whose appearance is sponsored by the UMD Department of Art, will conduct a workshop for UMD print classes Thursday and Friday. The classes are taught by Philip Meany, UMD instructor in art.

Warnholtz has been a member of the Carleton faculty since 1949. He earned both the Bachelor and Master of Fine Arts degrees at the State University of Iowa, Iowa City.

He has won numerous prizes and purchase awards for his paintings and has held one-man shows at the Walker Art Center, at Carleton and several institutions in the Midwest. In 1964 he was one of four artists to receive a Tamarid Lithography Workshop grant for a six-week seminar in lithography at the John Herron School of Art, Indianapolis, Ind.
