DULUTH--UMD's 13th annual Sno-Week celebration takes over the Duluth campus Feb.9-16. A "Kampus Klondike" theme will be reflected in everything from snow sculpturing to tall tales to ragtime music and, of course, sno-queen judging.

Lois Borg, McGrath, and Hans Tronnes, Duluth, are co-chairmen of the event. John Radosevich, Duluth, has been placed in charge of button sales which begin Thursday(Feb.7).

A ski trip to the Mount Telemark area near Cable, Wis. and a Sno-Jam(twist dance) open a varied agenda of activities Friday(Feb.9). The dance from 9 p.m. to midnight in Kirby Student Center will feature music by "The Accidentals".

The Sourdough Rendezvous has been planned from 8-11 p.m. Monday (Feb. 11) with "The Tamburitzans" furnishing the music. Also, voting begins for a queen to reign over the last days of "Kampus Klondike".

The fun reaches a peak Tuesday(Feb.12) on Lincoln's Birthday with no classes scheduled.

A queen will be crowned Wednesday(Feb.13) during the Wee Whilers folk singing concert from 8-10 p.m. in Kirby ballroom. The chosen coed and the winner of the beard growing contest will reign over the remainder of Sno-Week.

Max Morath, a leading exponent of turn-of-the-century music, will present "Ragtime Revisited" at 8 p.m. Thursday and Friday(Feb.14-15) in Kirby ballroom. A native of Colorado, Morath has been called the "ideal spokesman" for ragtime by Variety magazine.

The Sno-Ball climaxes the week Saturday(Feb.16) in Kirby Student Center. Music for dancing and listening will be provided by three bands from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. Jim Cole's Combo will play on the cafeteria level, The Revellers have been booked for the lounge and Bill Kovero's Vagabonds will play in the ballroom.
