



Harrison Cleary Earns D2CCA All-America Third Team Accolades

ALBANY, N.Y. – University of Minnesota Crookston senior men's basketball player [Harrison Cleary](#) (G, Oak Creek, Wis.) garnered Division II Conference Commissioners Association (D2CCA) All-America Third Team honors, as voted on by Division II members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and announced on Wed, March 25.

Cleary earns D2CCA All-America honors for the second time in his illustrious career, as he earned D2CCA All-America Honorable Mention accolades as a sophomore during the 2017-18 season. Cleary adds his highest All-America accolades, joining an impressive list in an outstanding four-year career at Minnesota Crookston. As a senior, Cleary was named All-NSIC First Team for the third-straight season. In addition, he was a D2CCA All-Central Region First Team selection, a NABC All-Central District Section Team pick, and a CoSIDA Academic All-America Second Team selection.

In addition, Cleary joined an elite group of just four players along with Dalton Bolon of West Liberty, Andrew Sischo of Daemen, and Selom Mawugbe to earn All-America honors both on and off the court, as all four were named CoSIDA Academic All-American earlier this season.

Cleary ended his career at Minnesota Crookston holding the school records for points, assists, three-pointers made, three-pointer attempted, field goals made, field goals attempted, free throws made, free throws attempted, free throw percentage, games played, and games started. Cleary is the NSIC's All-Time Leading Scorer with 2,107 career points in conference play. In addition, he is 16th all-time in NCAA Division II scoring with 2,846 career points and is the highest-scoring player in NCAA Division II since 1992. Cleary has earned All-NSIC accolades all four years at Minnesota Crookston. He is a three-time D2CCA All-Region Selection. As a senior, Cleary ended the season fourth in NCAA Division II scoring with 26.6 points per game. He was eighth in the nation for free throw percentage at 90.8 percent. In addition, he was sixth in NCAA Division II for total points with 771. Cleary shot 38.9 percent from beyond the arc, and also tallied 4.2 assists per game.

Cleary was one of two NSIC players to earn D2CCA All-America honors, joining Brandon Myer of University of Minnesota Duluth. Jordan Floyd of King University was named the Division II Conference Commissioners Association (D2CCA) 2020 Men's Basketball Ron Lenz Player of the Year.

Cleary was joined on the third team by Brian Halums of Arkansas-Fort Smith, Shadeed Shabazz of Alaska Fairbanks, Myer of Minnesota Duluth, and Selom Mawugbe of Azusa Pacific.
