DULUTH--Fifteen communities and places of geologic interest en route are on the itinerary for a three-day historical geology field trip by 41 UMD students beginning Sunday (May 25) under direction of Robert L. Heller, associate professor, and Richard Ojakangas, instructor, UMD geology department.

Annually conducted to acquaint students with areas of geologic significance in the upper Midwest, the tour by chartered bus will cover more than 700 miles.

Stops Sunday will be made at or near North Branch, Taylors Falls, Stillwater, Hastings, Red Wing, Reads Landing, Lake City and Winona; Monday, LaCrosse, Spring Grove, Harmony, Preston and Lanesboro; Tuesday, Chatfield, Rochester and Spooner.

Sandstone deposits near Hinckley, glacial history of the Mississippi river in the Red Wing-Lake City area, building stone quarries at Winona, fossil deposits near LaCrosse, caves in the Harmony district and iron deposits in the Chatfield-Rochester areas will be among tour features.
