

Stringent Budget

"The final action of the Minnesota legislature underwrites the basic integrity and service of the University--but it will require stringent budgeting for the next two years," President Morrill said in a statement.

"We shall be short of staff to meet the problem of increased enrolment; we shall not be able to improve faculty salaries to the extent they need so seriously to be improved, and our equipment needs and plant maintenance requirements are far from soundly financed," he said.

"The problem faced by the legislature was larger than the issue of University support alone," President Morrill continued. The final taxation compromise, so difficult to work out, helped to rescue the University from critical retrenchment and downgrading.

"We must remember that once again the people of Minnesota have granted generous millions for our University ongoing and have provided by appropriations for some new buildings, a start toward meeting the space needs for the larger teaching and research job ahead," he said.

"The legislature did the best it could, I feel, in a very tight fiscal situation--and all who are interested in the University, who rely upon it and who serve it have reason to be grateful for the final outcome," the president concluded. (The Minnesota Daily, April 29, 1955)
