### THE UNIVERSITY SENATE

The University Senate will meet Wednesday, November 3, at 4:30 p.m. in the Library of the Main Engineering building. The Constitution of the Senate provides for the following membership: the President; the Deans; all Professors, including Acting Professors; Associate Professors; the University Librarian; and any members of the University Faculty holding executive positions carrying, by authority of the Board of Regents, the rank of Professor or Associate Professor; the Presidents Emeritii; the Professors Emeritii; and Professors who devote less than half time to the work of the University, are entitled to participate in the discussions of the Senate, but not to vote. Assistant Professors and Instructors who may be members of the Standing Committee of the Senate, may, during their term of service, participate in the Senate discussion, but not vote.
