DULUTH -- A full length, 16mm color film, "A Lonely Land And Its Wild Kingdom," will be presented at 8 p.m. Monday, January 18, in the Science Auditorium under sponsorship of the UMD Geology Club.

Filmed by Duluthian Harold Knutson, a geologist with the Roberts Mining Company and former photographer for WDSM-TV, it resulted from a six-month expedition in the Bathurst Inlet region of the Canadian Arctic.

The film and colored slides on the geology and wild life of the region will be personally narrated by Knutson. Included are rare shots of the almost extinct muskox, whistler swans and bull caribou as well as Wilberforce Falls, a 160-foot cataract rarely seen by man.

Admission is free and the film is open to the public. Contributions will be asked to help defray filming expenses.
