The quarter grade reports for the fall quarter will be mailed to all students on January 3, 1929. Reports for those students whose home ad-

resses are in the Twin Cities will be sent through United States Mail, and for the other students through the University mail and Post Office Boxes.

### Changes of Registration Made Necessary by Failures in Fall Quarter Subjects

Students residing in the Twin Cities, who must change their registration owing to failures received in fall quarter courses, must make these changes on January 4 or 5 if they are in the Arts College, and on January 5, if in any other college. THE REGULAR LATE CHANGE OF REGISTRATION PENALTY WILL BE IN EFFECT FOR THIS GROUP OF STUDENTS ON MONDAY, JANUARY 7, 1929.

Students who do not reside in the Twin Cities will be allowed to make any necessary changes of registration (those made necessary by failures in full quarter courses) on Monday, January 7, without penalty. THE REGULAR LATE PENALTY FOR THIS GROUP OF STUDENTS WILL BE IN EFFECT ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 8, 1929. Any unnecessary changes of registration must be made either on January 4 or 5, 1929, or they will be subject to the regular late penalties.

### NOTICE TO ALL STUDENTS IN JUNIOR COLLEGE, WHOSE REGISTRATION FOR THE WINTER QUARTER WAS POSTPONED UNTIL JANUARY 4 OR 5, 1929

In the letter which you received from the Junior College Office, it was announced that your registration would be postponed, but that you would receive your fee statement in advance, and that your fees were due in advance, as in the case of those students who registered this fall, for the winter quarter. A CHANGE IN THE REGISTRATION PROCEDURE HAS BEEN DECIDED UPON, AND YOUR REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR THE WINTER QUARTER IS AS FOLLOWS:

1. You will not receive your fee statement in advance. A notice will be mailed to your postoffice box this week, which notice will admit you to the registration room on January 4 or 5, without your fee receipt. IF YOU DO NOT GET THIS NOTICE BY THURSDAY OF THIS WEEK, CALL AT WINDOW 22 REGISTRAR'S OFFICE FOR A DUPLICATE.
2. On presenting this notice at Room 101 Folwell Hall on January 4 or 5, you will be admitted for registration.
3. After your blank has been approved by an adviser and tallied, turn it in at your college window at the Registrar's office. DO NOT TURN IT IN AT FOLWELL HALL.
4. When you turn in your blank, it will be checked by the clerk, and you will be given your fee statement for the winter quarter.
5. All registrations must be completed, AND FEES PAID, by closing time on Saturday, January 5, 1929.

### WINTER QUARTER FEES

1. Statements covering the winter quarter fees have been mailed to the post-office boxes of all students now registered at the University. December 26 is the last date for payment of the same without penalty. PAYMENTS RECEIVED AFTER THAT DATE MUST BEAR A POSTMARK PRIOR TO 12 O'CLOCK MIDNIGHT ON DECEMBER 26 TO AVOID PENALTY. The penalty for late payment is \$2.00 until January 7, 1929. It increases at the rate of \$1.00 per day beginning on that date. Students who must write home for money or make loans are specially urged to complete such arrangements within the time limit in order to avoid the penalty. Students are urged to mail their remittances early because of the delays incident to the holiday mails.

2. Fee statements are issued on the basis of the records as they now appear. Approved petitions or memoranda modifying the records, and consequently the fees, must be filed within the time limit. IF NOT, THE STUDENT MUST PAY THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE STATEMENT, AND SECURE A SUBSEQUENT REFUND IF NECESSARY.

3. Remittances must be for the exact amount of the fee statement; the Bursar cannot accept checks, drafts, or money orders in excess of the same. INSUFFICIENT OR INCORRECT REMITTANCES WILL BE RETURNED TO THE STUDENT AT HIS OWN RISK, AND STUDENTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PENALTIES THAT MAY BE INCURRED BY THIS ACTION. Students will likewise be responsible for penalties or delays caused by non-negotiable checks or drafts.

4. All checks, drafts, and money orders should be made payable to The University of Minnesota. In remitting by mail, checks should be mailed to the Bursar's office of the University. ALL THREE SECTIONS OF THE FEE STATEMENT MUST ACCOMPANY THE REMITTANCE.

5. FAILURE TO RECEIVE A FEE STATEMENT CANNOT BE ACCEPTED AS A SUFFICIENT REASON FOR LATE PAYMENT OR NON-PAYMENT OF FEES. Any student who does not receive a fee statement in his post-office box may secure a duplicate statement at his college window in the Registrar's Office. Students whose work takes them from the campus must inform the Registrar's office of their change of address.

6. Trainees—the State Division of Re-Education, Foreign Government Students and the beneficiaries of the scholarship funds of miscellaneous agencies, must secure the written endorsement of the Assistant Registrar on their fee statement, and present them to the Bursar within the time limit, to avoid the penalty.

7. Students who plan to register in another college next quarter should not pay the fee statement sent to them. These students will register as new students in the college they plan to enter, and will pay fees at the time of registration. Their registration will not be complete until the fees of the college in which they plan to register have been paid.
