

Freshmen, Sophomore, Junior Men to Meet

A meeting of all freshmen men at 11:00 A.M. Tuesday, January 16th, and a meeting of all sophomore and junior men at 11:00 A.M. Thursday, January 18th, in the auditorium, have been called by Dr. John B. King. Attendance at these meetings takes precedence over all classes or other activities scheduled at the eleven o'clock hour on Tuesday and Thursday.

Faculty members are invited to attend these meetings. Division chairmen, department heads, and members of the Administrative and National Emergency committees are requested to be present.

The purpose of the meetings is to provide information for UMD men students concerning developments in selective service and other military service opportunities.

Civilian Defense Program

The Red Cross has asked the University to help in the Civilian Defense Program by supplying first aid instructors.

The program includes the training of 15,000 people in this area in the Standard First Aid Course. To meet this goal the services of 200 qualified instructors are needed. At present there are only forty in the area.

Requirements for qualifications include:

The Standard First Aid Course - 18 hours

The Advanced First Aid Course - 12 hours

The Instructor's Course - 16 hours

These requirements may be met by taking the courses at the Red Cross Headquarters in the Board of Trade building or on campus under Dr. Elizabeth Graybeal.

The Advanced Course will start Friday, January 12th, at three o'clock in Main 113.

A Standard Course may be offered at three o'clock on Tuesday and/or Thursday or in the evening on campus if requested.

If you are willing to participate in this phase of the defense program, you are asked to contact Professor Graybeal, UMD representative on the First Aid Committee.

No-Smoking Notice

Inasmuch as the State Fire Marshal has prohibited smoking at any time in the Main building, the administration requests that a prominent notice to this effect be carried in all printed or mimeographed programs for evening events scheduled in the Main building and requesting all patrons to cooperate in observing this regulation.
