Duluth --- Provost Raymond W. Darland announced Monday that the University of Minnesota Graduate School has approved a Master of <sup>Science</sup> ~~Arts~~ degree program in chemistry for offering on the UMD campus.

This program involves a thesis based upon original research. The research areas initially contemplated are in the fields of inorganic and physical chemistry. The program will be particularly beneficial to students seeking a career in college or junior college teaching as well as in industrial research, Dr. Darland said.

Students will be admitted to this program through the same procedures already in operation on the Minneapolis campus.

This is the fifth Master of Arts major program on the UMD campus and the first in the sciences. The other four M.A. programs are in curriculum and instruction, education, educational psychology (high school counseling) and English.
