

DULUTH--A victorious bulldog with a battle-weary chimp in tow symbolize UMD's 14th annual Homecoming theme "Enslavus Gustavus."

Chairman Hal Segal, Duluth, said the Bulldogs-Gustavus game Saturday, Oct. 14 will be preceded by two weeks of activities in an attempt to make this "the biggest and best homecoming ever."

Events start with a tea for queen contestants Monday, Oct. 2. Button sales get underway Wednesday, Oct. 4. The Homecoming Variety Show is slated Monday, Oct. 9; polka party Tuesday, Oct. 10; and jazz concert Wednesday, Oct. 11.

The new Homecoming queen will be announced at the bonfire and pep rally on Friday, Oct. 13, to be followed by a street dance in the Science parking lot on the new campus.

Saturday, Oct. 14 the traditional parade will get underway at 10 a.m. in downtown Duluth. UMD plays Gustavus Adolphus at 2 p.m. in Public Schools Stadium and the student Homecoming dance is from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. in Kirby Ballroom. Alumni will center their activities -- a social hour, dinner and dance with the UMD "M" Club -- at Hotel Duluth.

Final event is the UMD Homecoming show with folk singers Joe and Penny Aronson Sunday evening in Kirby Ballroom.

During the celebration campus clubs will be competing for participation points and trophies.
