BLUE CROSS-BLUE SHIELD-GROUP HEALTH PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS - 1969-----Because of rate changes in 1969, figures on the "Hospitalization Payments" memo dated January 27, 1970 apply only to 12-month staff members. Nine-month staff members paid insurance as follows: Blue Cross-Blue Shield High Option - \$286.74; Low Option - \$165.96; Group Health - \$300.54. Group Health payments by 12-month staff members were \$298.44. Anyone who does not satisfy the following qualifications should contact the Department of Insurance and Retirement, 30 Johnston Hall, Minneapolis campus, for exact deductions: (1) Must have retained coverage without change, (2) Must have remained on payroll continuously without having received a leave of absence without salary, (3) 9-month employees must have been employed on a continuing basis beginning in the 1967-68 academic year, or earlier; 12-month employees must have continuous coverage with effective date no later than January 1, 1969. MUSICAL COMPOSITIONS-----Two new musical compositions by Addison M. Alspach were presented at the Matinee Musical Founder's Day program on February 3 in Pilgrim Congregational Church, Duluth. One composition, "Varieties for Harp," was performed by Mrs. Brandon Southworth, and the other composition entitled, "Three Curiosities for Four Clarinets," was performed by four UMD students, under the supervision of Robert E. Williams.

APPOINTED-----The National Council of Teachers of English has appointed Anna L. Stensland as State Chairman of its Achievement Awards Program for 1970. This nationally recognized competition, now in its thirteenth year, grants recognition to outstanding high school seniors for excellence in English, and recommends them for scholarship aid. Over 7,500 students were candidates for Awards in 1969.

HUMANITIES PROGRAM-----Fred E. H. Schroeder attended planning sessions at Princeton University for a new program, the National Humanities Series, funded by a \$700,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities. Dr. Schroeder will lead one of five teams, consisting also of professional actors, musicians, artists, and dancers, which will visit 29 small towns in 20 states during February through May. The purpose of the series is to bring a greater awareness of the humanities to small towns around the nation.
