By action of the Board of Regents, all students receiving degrees are required to pay a graduation fee of \$10 for each degree received. The Registrar's office has mailed a special fee statement to each candidate for a degree on June 14. These fees should be paid as early as possible. Any student having failed to receive his fee statement may request a duplicate copy at the appropriate window. Under no condition will a diploma be issued until the graduation fee has been paid.

The mere receipt by a student of a graduation fee statement is not to be construed as a guarantee by the University that a degree will be granted. Subject to rules governing all refundments, students who fail to meet the requirements may secure a refundment of the graduation fee at window 23, Registrar's office.

NOTICE TO ALL INSTRUCTORS

Under the regulations of the University Senate, final reports for the spring quarter are due in the Registrar's office not later than 12 o'clock noon, Wednesday, June 16. On the following Friday morning students will be registered for the first term of the summer session.

Owing to the fact that attendance at the summer session on the part of many students is contingent on the result of their work during the spring quarter, it is important that instructors submit their reports not only within the time limit, but as soon as possible after each examination.

It is requested that instructors with examinations on June 9 and 10 submit their reports on June 12, or earlier, and that instructors with examinations on June 11 and 12 submit their reports as much in advance of June 16 as possible.

The Registrar's office will make every effort to have all final grades recorded before registration opens for the summer session so that necessary information concerning students' records can be furnished promptly to such faculty committees, advisers, and administrative officers as request this information. It will be possible to do this only with the complete co-operation of each instructor.

THE MEDICAL SCHOOL

Student Notice

I. Beginning with the Fall Quarter 1927, a general examination on the work of the Medical Course will be given in the Medical School, the passing of which will be essential for the M. B. degree. This examination may be taken in the early part of the twelfth quarter of Medical School attendance by any student whose record at that time in accordance with the scholarship rules is satisfactory. The examination will be offered each quarter when there are candidates.

II. This examination as applied to the classes of December, 1927, March and June, 1928, will be set entirely by the clinical departments, as applied to the classes of December, 1928, March and June, 1929, it may include in addition, questions set by the Department of Bacteriology (special Bacteriology), Anatomy (Nervous Anatomy), Physiology (not including Physiological Chemistry), Pathology and Pharmacol-

ogy. After June, 1929, it may include questions set by any department and on any part of the medical course.

III. This examination will in no way affect marks received by students in individual courses nor require the repetition of courses, nor affect the requirements for the B.S. or A.B. degree; but failure in this examination or parts thereof may require further preparation by students in any subject or subjects in the medical curriculum.
