All-Time Series vs. Mavericks: Minnesota leads 3-1-2

This Season vs. Mavericks: (January 29-30, 2000) - The two teams met for only two games this season, splitting a pair of one-goal contests at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis. The Golden Gophers claimed a 3-2 win in game one, with sophomore **F John Pohl (Red Wing, Minn.)** leading the way by scoring the first two goals and assisting on the game winning goal for a three-point evening. The Mavericks posted their first-ever win over the Golden Gophers in game two of the series with a wild 6-5 triumph in game two. Minnesota battled back three times from deficits (2-1, 4-3, 5-4) to tie the game at 5-5 and send it to an extra session. Junior **D Dylan Mills (Duluth, Minn.)** and freshman **F Jeff Taffe (Hastings, Minn.)** each scored two goals for the Golden Gophers. Minnesota was 4-for-11 (.364) on the power play while holding MSU, Mankato to 1-for-9 (.111) with the man advantage.

Series Notes: Despite only winning one game in the series, the Mavericks have held a lead at some point in all six contests • the Golden Gophers have outscored the Mavericks 9-3 in the third period of the six games • this is the first meeting between the two teams in the postseason

Experience Factor?: This is the first appearance for the Mavericks in the WCHA Final Five, while the Golden Gophers have participated in 12 of the 13 conference tournaments.

News & Notes

The Coaches: Minnesota Head Coach **Don Lucia** is in his first season with the Golden Gophers. Lucia, who has compiled a record of 298-172-30 (.626) in 13 seasons overall as a head coach, led Colorado College to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last four seasons. Lucia was 166-68-18 (.694) in six seasons with the Tigers, and is 132-62-18 (.665) in WCHA games. Lucia has a career record of 9-1-0 vs. the Mavericks. Lucia has a mark of 18-7 in WCHA playoff games, and a 7-5 record in WCHA Final Five games. MSU, Mankato Head Coach **Don Brose** is in his 31st season and final season at the helm of the Maverick program, with a career record of 534-333-73 (.607).

Lucia Makes Game #500 Memorable: Don Lucia coached in his 500th career game with Minnesota's memorable 3-2 overtime win at Colorado College last Saturday night. The next milestone for Lucia is within reach this weekend, as he is two wins shy of career victory number 300.

Pairwise Implications This Weekend: With three WCHA teams bunched up between 13th and 16th in the Pairwise Rankings, there is great meaning to this weekend's games at Target Center. St. Cloud State (13th), MSU, Mankato (14th), and Minnesota (16th) are all still very much alive for an NCAA tournament bid. A total of 12 teams comprise the NCAA tournament field. Wisconsin (1st) and North Dakota (3rd) have already assured themselves of an automatic and at-large berth, respectively. The 2000 NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Selection Show will be on Sun., March 19 at 12:30 p.m., on ESPN2.

Hauser Shines In Return: Sophomore G **Adam Hauser (Bovey, Minn.)**, who had missed Minnesota's final four regular season games with a bout of mononucleosis, returned to the nets last weekend for the first round of the WCHA playoffs by kicking away 54 of 58 shots in the two wins over Colorado College. Minnesota is 19-12-2 in Hauser's 33 starts this season, and winless (0-5-0) in the five games he has missed. Hauser currently has the third-highest save percentage in a season by a Golden Gopher goalie (see box on next page).

Ugly Streak Gone: With their come-from-behind win Saturday night at World Arena against Colorado College, the Golden Gophers broke a streak that had been haunting them for nearly three calendar years. Minnesota had been winless in its previous 43 games (0-38-5) when trailing after two periods before erasing a 1-0 Tiger lead, eventually resulting in a 3-2 overtime win, after two frames Saturday.

Goals From Unlikely Sources: Of the seven goals Minnesota scored last weekend, four clutch tallies were from players not known for their scoring prowess. Sophomore F **Erik Wendell (Maple Grove, Minn.)**, freshman D **Matt DeMarchi (Bemidji, Minn.)**, junior F **Stuart Senden (Alexandria, Minn.)**, and sophomore D **Mark Nenovich (Plymouth, Minn.)** had combined for just 10 goals in 121 games this season and 26 goals in 247 combined career games before last weekend. Wendell's goal opened the scoring in Friday's win, with Nenovich's tally knotting Saturday's game late in the third period. Senden's overtime goal clinched the Final Five berth for the Golden Gophers.

Pohl Passes 50: Sophomore F **John Pohl (Red Wing, Minn.)** assisted on a pair of goals in Saturday's win, including winning a key faceoff to help set up Stuart Senden's game-winning goal. Pohl, who leads the Golden Gophers in scoring (17-35--52), is the first U of M sophomore forward to score 50 points or more in a single season since Craig Johnson had 19-39--58 during the 1991-92 campaign. Pohl's 35 assists are the most by a Golden Gopher forward since Hobey Baker Award winner Brian Bonin had 47 assists in 1995-96.

Keys To Success: Minnesota is 35-for-92 (.380) with the man advantage in its 19 wins and just 16-for-104 (.154) in its 17 losses and two ties. The Golden Gopher penalty kill has been equally important in the outcome of games this season, as they have extinguished 91-of-104 (.875) opponent power-play chances in wins and 71-of-88 (.807) man advantage opportunities in losses.

Specialty Team Specialists: The Golden Gophers have outnumbered their opponents 76-45 in all non-five-on-five situations this season, but have been outscored 73-59 in full strength occasions. Minnesota only allowed one 5-on-5 goal in last weekend's first-round playoff sweep of Colorado College.

A Shot Here Or There: Minnesota is 6-9 in 15 one-goal games this season - by contrast, WCHA regular-season champion Wisconsin is 8-2 in 10 games decided by one goal.

Golden Gophers At Target Center

Minnesota has a 6-2-1 mark in recorded games at Target Center, not including a pair of losses in Hall of Fame exhibition games. The Golden Gophers are 1-2 in postseason games at Target Center (last season's NSP/WCHA Final Five), and are 5-0-0 against 1999-2000 WCHA regular-season titleholder Wisconsin in the downtown building. Miller Time: Senior F **Nate Miller (Anoka, Minn.)** has not only been a leader off the ice for the Golden Gophers as the 1999-2000 captain, but has also led by example with three game-winning goals this season. Miller netted a short-handed goal in Friday's win over Colorado College which proved to be the margin of victory and has scored 10 of his 14 goals this season away from Mariucci Arena. Miller has played in 136 consecutive games and 160 of 162 possible games in his Golden Gopher career. Dating back to his days with the Twin Cities Vulcans of the USHL, Miller has played in 260 of his team's last 262 games.

The Luck Of The Draw: Each WCHA team plays four games per season against five teams and two games per season against the four remaining squads. Minnesota played 22 of its 28 conference games this season against the top five teams in the WCHA, while playing three of the four teams below them in the standings only two games each (Michigan Tech, Alaska Anchorage, Denver).

Westrum Makes His Point Memorable: Junior F **Erik Westrum (Apple Valley, Minn.)** reached the 100-point plateau by scoring the game-tying goal with 8.8 seconds remaining in Saturday's win over Colorado College. Westrum, who has 23 career multiple-point games, leads the team with 24 goals this season and has totals of 39-61--100 in 117 career games.

Notes: Minnesota is unbeaten in 13 games this season when outscoring its opponent in 5-on-5 situations (12-0-1) • in four games at World Arena this season, there were no first-period goals scored by either Minnesota or Colorado College • Minnesota is 10-5-0 when taking more penalties than its opponent, and just 9-12-2 when being whistled for the same or fewer infractions than the opposition • the team that has scored first has won nine of Minnesota's last 11 games • in Minnesota's last eight games, the team that has more shots on goal has won • the Golden Gophers improved their WCHA first-round playoff record to 25-3-0 since the current best two-of-three format was adopted • senior F **Dave Spehar (Duluth, Minn.)** led the Golden Gophers with six shots on goal in Saturday's win over Colorado College • Minnesota has now played nine overtime games this season (3-4-2), which is tied for the fourth most in school history
