TWEED MUSEUM OF ART SCHEDULE

The exhibition “Sarah Bauer, Nun’-dro” will run through January 12. Bauer is an assistant professor of Art and Design at UMD and a new media/multimedia artist who has shown in the U.S. and abroad.

“Arts Intersect” will be presented at 7 p.m. on January 10 and 11, 2003 in the Tweed Museum’s Sax Sculpture Gallery. This performance event will be a 3-D collage of live dance, music, painting and poetry, set within the Tweed’s atrium space. Artists from the UMD community include: Choreography, poetry and “Gel Babies” projected room-size by Lisa McKhann (Project Lulu, and past-adjunct faculty of Modern Dance); Original piano by Andrew Floberg (UMD Department of Music alumnus); Silk painting by Lee Zimmerman (adjunct faculty of Electrical Engineering); Set and light design by Jeffrey Petersen (award-winning student of UMD Theatre Department); Dancers Renée Moe, Missy Peschman, & Ramona Treuer (alumna of UMD dance); Poetry by Mary Kay Rummel (UMD Education Department). Plus: Spoken word by Marilyn Mayry and Althea McBurrows; Costume design by Jan Chronister and Dancer Jill Hall. A \$5 donation is requested.

The exhibit “Body of Clay - Soul of Fire: Richard Bresnahan and Art from the Saint John’s Pottery” will be on exhibit from January 14 - March 23. A reception and short lecture will be held at the at 6 p.m. on February 4 in the Tweed. “Body of Clay - Soul of Fire” features 46 works by artists associated with St. John’s Pottery over the past twenty years, including works by eleven artists sponsored by the Grotto Foundation, and by twenty artists who have held Jerome Foundation-sponsored residencies at the pottery studio. Some of their work echoes Bresnahan’s style with its subtle coloration and irregular splashes of natural ash glaze achieved from being fired in the studio’s wood-fired kiln. Others reflect the independent directions taken by artists after working at the studio. Richard Bresnahan presents an artist lecture on February 4 at 10 a.m. in the Tweed Museum of Art. The exhibition is accompanied by the recently released 230-page book Body of Clay, Soul of Fire: Richard Bresnahan and the Saint John’s Pottery, written by Matthew Welch The book is available for purchase in the Tweed Museum Store.
