Registration for the third quarter will take place in Room 106, Folwell Hall, according to the schedule outlined below:

Seniors, February 19 to 21.

Juniors, February 23 to 25.

Sophomores, February 26 to March 6.

Freshmen, March 5 to 20.

Pre-Dental students, Saturday afternoon, February 28.

Unclassed, February 26 to 27.

Each student will receive an individual notice and a third quarter program through the University Post Office, not later than two days before the day assigned for his registration.

Seniors whose names begin with letters A to H, inclusive, will register on Thursday, February 19. Seniors whose names begin with letters I to S, inclusive, will register on Friday, February 20 and all other Seniors on Saturday, February 21. Juniors will be divided as follows: A to G on Monday, February 23, H to M on Tuesday, February 24, and all others on Wednesday, February 25. Hours of registration are 8:30 to 12:00 and 1:30 to 5:30, except on Saturday, when the afternoon hours are omitted.

In case of failure to register at the time assigned, it will be necessary to register at the Registrar's Office. The penalty for such late registration is \$5.00.
