UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA, DULUTH
FACULTY MEETING, OCTOBER 22, 1963

The faculty assembled for the regular fall meeting in Room 116 Social Science Building at 3:30 p.m. with Provost Darland presiding.

At the opening of the meeting, Dr. Darland indicated that the agenda had been prepared with the advice of the Faculty Council, and the items would be discussed in the order shown on the agenda which had been previously distributed.

1. Members of the Senate and Faculty Council currently holding office were introduced. The Senate members are:

Wendell P. Glick is vice-chairman of the faculty and Cecil H. Meyers is secretary for 1963-64.

The Duluth representative to the all-university Faculty Consultative Committee for the current academic year is Henry Lepp.

2. Provost Darland reported on the status of the United Fund Drive and indicated that the UMD quota of \$5,500 was now 94% complete.
3. Speaking for the Athletic Committee, Emmett Davidson reported on recent changes in eligibility rules for the MIAC Conference and pointed out that the net effect of such changes was to generally make eligibility more stringent. A summary of the changes was made available to faculty members.
4. Rudolph Johnson, UMD Librarian, reported on the status and progress of building plans for the new Library addition. It was pointed out that while the plans were not yet finalized, basic decisions were being made at this time. Construction should begin in the spring of 1964. When completed, the new Library will house about 250,000 volumes as compared to the present capacity of 75,000 volumes. Total seating capacity in the Library will be 1,200 persons compared to the present limit of 350 persons. Additional information relative to the Library planning may be obtained from Mr. Johnson.
5. Provost Darland spoke of the plans for enlarging Kirby Student Center and indicated that bids will be received at an early date. The Student Center enlargement should be completed by the end of summer, 1964. It is expected that Faculty Club facilities will also be completed by next summer.
6. Dean Chamberlin reported that the accreditation committee of the

N.C.A.T.E. (National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education) would visit the campus in the spring of 1965, but that UMD must begin to gather the necessary data beginning with the current quarter. He also pointed out that the new college catalog must be prepared by January 15, 1964 and asked all departments to reevaluate their course structures as soon as possible in order that the desired changes may be incorporated in the new bulletin.

7. Dr. Darland announced that the Faculty Council will be studying and reevaluating the Associate in Arts program and urged faculty members to express their views to the chairman, Henry Ehlers, as soon as possible.
8. Dr. Darland reported on the status of discussions between UMD and the Duluth Board of Education relative to the feasibility of establishing an elementary school on the UMD campus. Dr. Darland indicated there were many complex issues involved and that a joint statement issued by Dr. Darland and Dr. Rasmussen of the Public School System had clearly stated that UMD and the Duluth Public Schools had agreed only to exploratory discussions and that no commitments beyond this had been made.

Note: A good deal of faculty discussion followed Dr. Darland's review of the possibility of a joint Laboratory School venture. A number of suggestions and statements of possible issues were heard.

A motion to adjourn was approved at 4:58 p.m.
