

DULUTH. . . Women graduates of Duluth State Teachers College holding baccalaureate or higher degrees are immediately eligible for membership in the American Association of University Women.

The announcement by Mrs. Robert E. Seguin, Duluth unit membership chairman, comes just a month after the acceptance of UMD into the AAUW program.

DSTC membership was accredited at a late February board meeting at national AAUW headquarters, Washington, D. C. During the proceedings, the board wrote the following statement into its rule book:

"When an institution not on an approved list is absorbed by an institution on the approved list, all holders of baccalaureate or higher degrees of the institution absorbed are eligible for membership."

Mrs. Seguin expressed pleasure at the announcement, "since we have had many requests to promote DSTC membership. The ruling will effect many fine people who are now eligible to join AAUW."

UMD and DSTC alumni have worked many years to promote AAUW membership, according to Roy H. Teppen, president of the UMD Alumni Association.

"Active encouragement by Provosts Darland, King and Gibson helped bring about the acceptance of Duluth campus women by the AAUW also," he said.
