Duluth --- Some 175 girls from eight Northeastern Minnesota high schools have registered for the annual UMD High School Playday in the campus' Physical Education building Saturday (February 29).

The all-day program consists of five instructional clinics in the morning, lunch and an activity period in the afternoon. Only the bowling clinic scheduled for the Woodland Lanes will be held off-campus.

Carol Kucler, Aurora, is acting chairman of the affair. She also is president of the Women's Recreation Association, sponsoring organization.

Denfeld and Stanbrook Hall from Duluth, AlBrook, Aurora-Hoyt Lakes, Buhl, Esko, Silver Bay and Two Harbors have registered students for the clinics in bowling, archery, gymnastics, synchronized swimming and modern dance.

UMD students will conduct the clinics and supervise the afternoon activities under chairman Cleo Birkholz of Two Harbors.

Ann Stangfield, Virginia, will conduct the bowling clinic which will cover the basic skills, safety and etiquette of the sport while Sandy Vicari, Chisholm, will direct the archery clinic.

The gymnastics clinic will provide a demonstration in the fundamental skills of six apparatus; the even parallel bars, the balance beam, the horse and vaulting box, free exercise on the floor, the flying rings and the trampoline.

Nancy Nyquist, Two Harbors, will head the gymnastics clinic staff. Her assistants will be Cleo Birkholz, Two Harbors; Cecily Karakas, Calumet; and Diane Weimer, Aitkin.

Charlotte Tisovich, Ely, has charge of the synchronized swimming. She and assistants Margaret Kocjancich, Aurora, and Linda Hagen and Lonnie Bijold, Proctor, each will teach a specific stunt. The instructors then will perform a synchronized routine using the four stunts.

The modern dance clinic to be conducted by Rennie Mead, Duluth, and Cookie Hendrickson, Tower, will consist of a warm-up period, the teaching of the dance and a creativity period in which the girls will use the dance they learned.

Supervisors for the afternoon activities include: Georgina Shapiro, Antioch, California and Miss Kocjancich, swimming lifeguards; Joan Smith and Chris Erickson, Duluth, volleyball; Mary Sue Jurkovich and Marianne Simney, Aurora, Ellen Hale, Detroit Lakes, and Lonnie Bijold, Proctor, mixed games. A school tour will be conducted for those who do not wish to swim.

Other committee chairman for the playday include: Judy Hanna, Duluth, decorations; Kathy Dent, Staples, and Miss Jorkovich, food; Miss Erickson, registration; Miss Jurkovich, invitations, and Miss Simney, publicity.

Mrs. Joan Hedrick, an instructor in women's physical education, is faculty advisor for the playday.
