### NOTICE TO DEPARTMENTS

The dates given on employment memoranda covering term of service should be inclusive dates. For example, January 16 to May 31 would mean a half month's pay for January and pay for four full months. Should the dates read January 15 to June 1, the employee might claim salary for one additional day (January 15) in addition to the half month's pay in January, and one day's pay for the 1st day of June in addition to the pay for four months.

Resignations should read as effective the day following the last day the employee works. For example: the resignation of an employee who works through the month should read as effective the first day of the following month.

### NOTICE

The General Storehouse will not accept personal packages "express collect" consigned to members of the various departments unless the persons to whom such packages are consigned make previous arrangements with the Receiving Clerk to take care of them, and also leave money with him to cover express charges.

When making arrangements for shipments to the University on University business please bear in mind that these should be consigned to the department, and not to the individual.
