
On Saturday morning, April 8, author Karen Hesse will be honored as the recipient of the 2006 Kerlan Award at a ceremony in Andersen Library. The Kerlan Award Committee, chaired by Julie Reimer, selected Hesse as the recipient of the award

The Kerlan Friends will host a breakfast buffet on April 8, 2006 in 120 Andersen Library. The event starts at 9:30 a.m. Cost for the buffet and talk is \$20. Free chairs are available, with reservation, for those wishing to attend only the 10:30 a.m. talk.

Hesse's books include Wish on a Unicorn (1991), Letters from Rifka (1992), A Time of Angels (1995), The Music of Dolphins (1996), and The Young Hans Christian Andersen(2005). Her 1998 novel Out of the Dust won the Newbery Medal. Sixteen manuscripts of Hesse's books reside in the Kerlan Collection. Hesse received a MacAr-

thur fellowship in 2002, the second children's author so honored.





# KRIS KIESLING - NEW ANDERSEN LIBRARY DIRECTOR OF SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

Kris Kiesling joined the University Libraries staff in September, 2006. In a meeting with the Kerlan Friends Board, she noted that her goals for the Elmer L. Andersen Library include a third cavern, reconfiguration of the Andersen Library atrium, and increased unit staffing.

Kris Kiesling is the first Elmer L. Andersen Director of Archives and Special Collections at the University of Minnesota Libraries. She comes to the University of Minnesota Libraries from the University of Texas at Austin. She served as Associate Director for Technical and Digital Services at the Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center and was previously Head of the Department of Manuscripts and Archives. She has been recognized as a fellow of the Society of American Archivists and an ARL Research Libraries Leadership Fellow. Her research and publication record is matched with an equally impressive list of lectures and workshops offered in locations around the globe.

# **IN MEMORIAM**

Margaret Hodges, 94, prize-winning children's author, died of heart disease Dec. 13, 2005 at her home in Verona, PA. The Kerlan Collection holds manuscripts for 27 of Hodges' books spanning thirty years from 1958 to 1988. Hodges ultimately published over fifty books, many dealing with myths and legends including *The Hatching of Joshua Cobb, Saint George and the Dragon*, and *The Voice of the Great Ball*. Margaret gave a talk at the Kerlan Collection July 11, 1985 entitled "Asbjørnsen, Moe and the Soul of Norway."

**Tana Hoban,** a photographer and author who produced dozens of illustrated books for children, died Jan. 27 at a hospice near Paris. She was 88 and had had a series of strokes and other ailments. Hoban donated photographs, notes, and dummies for ten titles to the Kerlan Collection, including *Count and See*.



# BARBARA KNUTSON MEMORIAL FUND

The Barbara Knutson Memorial Fund at the Children's Literature Research Collections was established in December, 2005 to support loans to schools of facsimiles from the Kerlan Collection of the author-artist's process of creating children's books. Chris Jensen, her husband, placed the complete set of manuscripts, original art and all related materials leading to the production of Barbara Knutson's most recent award winning title *Love and Roast Chicken: a Trickster Tale from the Andes Mountains* (Carolrhoda, 2004). As executor of her estate, he granted permission for the project.


