SOLAR ECLIPSE-----Duluth should experience more than 90% of the total eclipse of the sun on Monday, February 26. The moon will begin casting its shadow about 10:00 a.m. with the darkest period occurring at about 10:50 a.m. It will be another 45 minutes before the eclipse ends. About 170 miles wide, the path of total darkness will move eastward along the northwestern United States, then northward through Montana and North Dakota into Canada. The duration of totality will be about three minutes at any location. Observers are reminded to not view the eclipse directly. Tuesday's Duluth Herald (front page) story offers suggestions on viewing the phenomena.

DENTAL HYGIENE CAPPING CEREMONIES-----Twenty dental hygiene students will receive caps in ceremonies at 2:00 p.m. Sunday, February 25, in the UMD Kirby Student Center Ballroom. The students, who are in their first year of study in dental hygiene, will be presented caps by second-year students in the program. Guest speaker at the ceremonies will be Provost Robert Heller with other presentations being made by Dr. Odin Langsjoen, director of the dental hygiene program, and Linda Saline, instructor.

SCIENCE FAIR----UMD's College of Letters and Science is serving as host for the Northeastern Minnesota Regional Science Fair to be held March 3 in the Kirby Student Center Ballroom. Exhibits from kindergarten through twelfth grade students will include topics on behavioral and social sciences, earth and space science, biology, chemistry, ecology, physics, mathematics and computer science. The public is invited to view the exhibits from 2-4 p.m. on March 3. Cash prizes will be awarded to the best projects and research papers with winners being eligible to participate in the state science fair.

LECTURE CONCERT-----Contemporary pianist Raymond Jackson will present a lecture concert at 8 p.m. February 26 in Bohannon Hall 90 as part of the nation-wide observance of Black History Month. Jackson, assistant professor of music at Howard University, Washington, D.C., will perform a varied selection of music at the free concert entitled "Piano Music of Black Composers." He has performed as a recitalist and orchestral soloist in the United States, Europe and South America and has received numerous honors and awards, one of them being the first concert artist in his native state elected into the Rhode Island Heritage Hall of Fame. The concert is co-sponsored by the UMD Music Department and the Institute of Afro-American Awareness.
