Duluth --- Robert H. Evans has been appointed a lecturer in philosophy at UMD for spring quarter, Provost Raymond W. Darland announced today. The appointment was approved today in Minneapolis by the University of Minnesota Board of Regents.

Evans will replace Dr. Henry J. Ehlers, professor and head of philosophy, who has been granted a single-quarter leave to do research in the field of logic.

Evans is a graduate of Plum High School, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree at the College of Wooster, Wooster, Ohio. He is nearing completion of his Ph.D. degree following graduate work at Indiana University and the University of Pittsburgh.

As an undergraduate, Evans won the John F. Miller prize and was awarded an Andrew Mellon Fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh for graduate work.

Evans is married and the father of three children.

Dr. Ehlers will continue during spring quarter a study on improving freshman-sophomore college courses in the field of logic. He will travel to Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Louis and other Midwest cities to consult with colleagues in philosophy.

Dr. Ehlers will resume teaching at UMD during first summer session term on June 15.
