

DULUTH--The fine art of folk singing in 12 different languages has given Martha Schlamme, 1958 UMD Homecoming concert artist, international prominence in the music world.

She will appear at 8 p.m. Friday (Oct. 17) in Kirby Student center. A nominal admission will be charged, according to Leonard Skrobel, Homecoming committee chairman. The concert will be open to the public.

Born in Vienna, Miss Schlamme received her voice training in England. She began her professional career in the Players Theatre, London.

Emigrating to the U. S. in 1948, Miss Schlamme began concert tours that have carried her with critical acclaim from coast to coast and many Canadian points.

Her recordings under Columbia, Folkways and Vanguard labels and her extensive appearances have brought widespread recognition in America and abroad to the folk singer. Warm, intuitive feeling combined with a concert singer's poise and quality set her apart among the artists who have done so much to bring the beauty and emotions of folk melodies and primitive song into the concert auditorium.
