Fit Sew Well is a practical method of adjusting patterns and eliminating many fittings often required for each garment sewn. The series is being presented by the Agricultural Extension Service of the University of Minnesota.

A study kit is available for \$1.50 which includes special measuring tools, a record for your measurements and adjustments and two books explaining the techniques for fitting dresses and pants.

University of Minnesota interior design and furnishings specialist Linda Reece advises consumers to look for new cleaning codes on upholstered furniture tags or labels.

Jot down the code in a place where you can find it when spot cleaning is needed.

The code is:

- W Use a water-based cleaner or dishwashing detergent foam
- S Use a mild water-free drycleaning solvent
- W-S Either a water-based detergent or water-free solvent is acceptable
- X Vacuum or brush to remove soil. Do not use water-based agents or any kind of solvent.

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
