DULUTH -- The second UMD Summer Session opens Monday (July 20) with registration from 8 a.m. to noon in the Physical Education building.

Over 120 courses including the first UMD summer classes ever offered in geology embrace special areas, workshops and institutes. Other courses are designed for high school students of this past June who desire a head start on their college program.

Morris Kantor, an American artist of national stature, returns to conduct the 16th annual Workshop in Advanced Painting. Kantor who also conducted the workshop last year has exhibited his work extensively since 1931 in major galleries across the country.

A Workshop in the Teaching of Modern Mathematics will be offered for elementary high school teachers from July 27 to August 7. Wager Collins, mathematics consultant at Robbinsdale High School, and Richard Hartman, head of the mathematics department for the Edina Public Schools, will be guest lecturers.

Other courses place special emphasis on the teaching of mentally retarded children, rural education and the graduate education program in business and economics.

Havard W. Archerd, supervisor of Admissions and Records, announced the procedures and rules for registration:

*All students registered for the first term should pick up their IBM registration permit cards Monday in Library 134 to prevent congestion and save time at the gymnasium.
