FACULTY MEN—TAKE THIS HOME TO YOUR WIVES!

The President and Mrs. Burton will be at home to all the members of the faculty and staff of the entire University tomorrow afternoon, Wednesday, April 23, from 3:30 to 5:30. The Deans and their wives will receive with President and Mrs. Burton. As this is their last regular day at home for the current academic year, a cordial invitation is extended to all the members of the staff on both campuses.

The distinguished critic, Professor OSCAR W. FIRKINS, of the University of Minnesota, will give a public lecture on "Whitman" in the Little Theater on Thursday, April 24, at half past four. The original date, Tuesday, April 22, has been changed to Thursday, April 24.

Mr. Firkins has been invited by the President of the University to give this lecture in honor of the centenary of the poet's birth. The anniversary day is actually May 31; but it has been necessary to set the date of the lecture earlier, because on May 1 Mr. Firkins is leaving the University on leave of absence to take up, in New York, his work on the new literary periodical, "The Review." He will be absent from the city for at least a year.
