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DULUTH -- Special course offerings in 12 academic areas will be offered during the second term of UMD Summer Session July 19-August 21.

An expected 800 graduate and undergraduate students are expected to register for the five week term from 8:00 a.m. to noon on July 19 in the Physical Education building.

Summer Session Chairman Valworth R. Plumb said that in addition to more than 60 regular courses, special offerings will include:

* Educational Television--- Two courses on the utilization and techniques of ETV will be taught by Fred W. Meitzer, assistant professor of speech.

* School Librarians--- Two courses---"Reading Guidance for Adolescents" and "Library Administration" -- are part of a sequence leading to minimum certification for school librarians in Minnesota. Instructor is James A. Bacon, library coordinator, Independent School District 281, Robbinsdale.

* Programmed Instruction--- Principles and techniques and construction of programmed materials for the classroom will be taught by Duluth Assistant Superintendent of Schools Thorwald Esbensen.

* Driver Education--- Provides the special background required for high school instructors in driver training. The course is taught by Dr. Lewis J. Rickert, professor of physical education.

* Advanced Painting Workshop--- The 17th annual workshop will be directed by Henry C. Pearson, Minneapolis campus artist.

* Geology--- "Historical Geology" will be taught by Charles E. Carson, lecturer in geology.

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* Educational Administration--- A course on "Foundations in Educational Administration" will be taught by Dr. Alvin W. Ollenburger, assistant professor of secondary education.

* Counseling--- A course on "Group Procedures in Guidance" will be given by Dr. Moy F. Gum, associate professor of psychology.

* Fluid Power Institute--- New developments in fluid power will be explained by Martin L. Mattson, instructor in industrial education.

* Workshop for Elementary and Secondary School Teachers--- The two week workshop July 26 to August 6 on the teaching of reading will be directed by Vernon L. Simula, assistant professor of elementary education.

* Courses for Recent High School Graduates--- Eighteen classes for students who wish to get a head start on their college studies.

* Master's Programs--- Courses which lead to the Master of Arts degree in education, English and history and the Master of Science degree in chemistry.
