

DULUTH--Dr. Gerald A. Gladstein, an associate professor of psychology at UMD, has accepted a faculty position at the University of Rochester (N.Y.), effective September 1962.

Dr. Gladstein will concentrate on the area of guidance and counseling as an associate professor of education at Rochester.

During his six years at UMD, Dr. Gladstein has been involved in the publication of one book and several articles on guidance and counseling. His book, in collaboration with Robert van Kleeck and Corrine Lauterbach, both of Duluth, was "The Teachers and Guidance in Minnesota."

His articles include "Study Behavior of Gifted Stereotype and Non-Stereotype College Students" and "A New Approach for Identifying Appropriate Individual Study Behavior."

During the summers of 1960 and 1961, Dr. Gladstein served as director of the Guidance and Counseling Institute on the UMD campus.

Dr. Gladstein is a member of the advisory committee on guidance counseling and testing for the Minnesota State Board of Education. Other memberships include: Northeast Minnesota Counselor Assn., American Psychological Assn., Minnesota Psychological Assn., Northern Minnesota Psychological Assn. and the American Personnel and Guidance Assn.

In April, Dr. Gladstein will serve on two panels dealing with group counseling during the APGA's national convention in Chicago.

A native of Hartford, Conn., Dr. Gladstein attended the University of Connecticut (BA) and the University of Chicago (MA, Ph.D.).

Dr. Gladstein is married and has three children; Richard, Deborah and Rose.
