Crookston shattered a six-game losing streak with an 86-70 win over Minot State University. Hughes' 36 points on 9-of-16 from the field, 6of-10 from beyond the arc and 12-of-12 from the charity stripe surpasses the previous mark set by Karna Plaine in 2003 and Jessica Forsline in 2000 and 2001. 


