DULUTH--One hundred twenty five Midwest teachers will study on the University of Minnesota's Duluth campus this summer under National Science Foundation stipends.

William R. McEwen, professor of mathematics and chairman of the UMD division of science and mathematics, is director of UMD's third institute for science and mathematics teachers in high school and junior high school. Blanchard O. Krogstad, assistant professor of biology, is associate director.

Designed to upgrade teaching of science and mathematics in the United States, the NSF summer institutes have been conducted on more than 100 American campuses in recent years.

The stipends provide tuition, travel and living expense for institute attendance.

Of the total receiving stipends for the UMD institute, 109 come from 62 Minnesota communities, 13 from 10 Wisconsin communities and one each from Ohio, Michigan and Iowa.

The recipients were chosen from approximately 865 applicants from a wide area.

For the first time this summer, the UMD institute will be conducted during both terms, June 14-July 18 and July 20-Aug.22.

In previous years, the institute has been conducted during the first summer term only.

Courses will include mathematics, biology, physics, earth science, chemistry and related activities. Visits to industrial and geographical sites of interest are scheduled.
