Duluth--- Applications for fall quarter admission to the two-year Air Force ROTC program at UMD will be accepted until Saturday (March 2). The Officer Qualification Test will be administered at 2 p.m. Saturday in the ROTC building on campus.

To qualify for the two-year program, candidates must pass the qualification test, take a physical examination and attend a six-week field training course during the summer of 1968.

Physical examinations are given at the Duluth Air Base Dispensary at no cost to applicants.

Applicants who are accepted will enroll in the upper division Air Force ROTC courses for which they are awarded 18 to 21 academic credits that can be applied toward the bachelor of arts degree. Upon graduation, ROTC cadets receive commissions as second lieutenants in the Air Force.

Young men at UMD or area junior colleges who are interested in the two-year program should contact the UMD Department of Aerospace Studies for additional information.
