NOTICE TO INSTRUCTORS

Examinations for the removal of conditions incurred during the winter quarter will be held as announced in the printed schedule delivered to all departments before the opening of the school year. Additional copies may be secured in the Registrar's Office.

Owing to the short time between the opening of the spring quarter and the dates set for the examinations of the first week, no lists of names of students having paid condition examination fees will be sent to the departments this week. Each student should be required to furnish a cashier's receipt showing payment of the fee for the subject in which he is to be examined.
