

and the rest of the United States.

2) they escape taxes by giving some of the profits to the University Foundation and other University investment funds. This increases the tax load of the citizens of Minnesota.

3) The Foundation is a reinvestment point for their South African profits.

4) They receive the benefits of free research and may hire from the pool of highly skilled technocrats, managers, and executives.

5) They seed and support special projects designed for their own profit, especially in the Institute of Technology and School of Business.

In addition to supporting the multi-national corporations, the University, as an education factory, pushes racist ideology which may be used to justify armed intervention in South Africa.

The University sponsors ROTC and so gives direct support to the military by providing it with officers.

United States industry has consistently relied upon the labor and resources of all parts of the world to sustain itself and has repeatedly used the military to gain that labor and those resources. Examples of this are the attempted invasion of Cuba, the war in Vietnam, and the military takeovers in Chile and Greece aided by the C.I.A.

Can we stop this complicity with fascism?

A mass movement of students and workers world-wide in alliance with the Vietnamese people forced a halt to the brutally racist war in Vietnam.

Popular sentiment kept us out of Angola.

Again we need an international multi-racial group of dedicated workers and students to initiate a pre-war anti-war movement around South Africa.

Racism is devastating to students and workers. Apathy and cynicism inevitably collaborate with racism.

The Committee Against Racism (CAR) is a multi-racial, rank and file, action-oriented and international organization pledged to actively fighting racism. It is this strategy that will conquer racism.

CAR DEMANDS OF THE UNIVERSITY THAT:

1) The University Foundation immediately liquidate any stocks, holdings, and investments it has in any corporation or firm that is either invested in South Africa or makes profit from the exploitation of South African labor and resources.

2) The bosses of any corporations implicated in South Africa be removed from the Board of Trustees of the University Foundation immediately-- especially James Binger, Honeywell, Inc., Harold Sweatt, Honeywell, Inc., Harry Heltzer, 3M, and Henry Rutledge, Banco.

3) The University of Minnesota make available to the public and publish in all area community newspapers all prospectuses and portfolios managed by the Foundation or any other investment mechanism and prove that it is not invested in South Africa.
