SIGRID MITCHELL MEMORIAL LECTURE John Ciardi, a visiting professor of English at UMD and a nationally-known poet and author of more than 30 books, will be the speaker at the Sigrid Mitchell Memorial Lecture at 9 a.m., Monday, Sept. 29, in the Tweed Museum Lecture Gallery at UMD. He will speak on "Why Do We Say That?", a talk on the origins of words and idioms. The lecture series, which is sponsored by the Continuing Education and Extension Office (CEE), was established in 1977 by friends of Sigrid Mitchell. Mitchell participated in CEE women's seminars from 1962 until her death in 1977. The lecture is free and open to the public.
