Duluth--- Robert Beverley, assistant professor of music, will be the featured soloist at the University Orchestra-Chorus Christmas concert at 8:15 p.m. Thursday (Dec. 6) in UMD's Kirby Student Center ballroom.

Beverley will perform in the dello Joio (correct)
"Concertante for Clarinet and Orchestra."

Melanie Roginski and Paula Quaderer, both of Duluth, will have prominent parts as harpists in the orchestra's performance of the Debussy "Nocturnes."

Other orchestral selections will include Glinka's "Overture to Russian and Ludmilla" and the "March Militaire Francaise" by Saint-Saens.

The University chorus will perform "Emanuel" by Billings; "As Lately We Watched," an Australian folk carol; and "God Grant Us," an English round.

The University concert choir of selected voices will sing "From Heights of Heaven to Earth I Fare" by Schein; "Glory be to God," by Rachmaninoff; "Dormi Jesu" by Rubbra; and "Glory to God" by Bitz good.

Both choruses will combine to perform "Fun, Fum, Fum!" a French carol.

Concert conductors will be Robert House, head of music, James Smith, associate professor of music, and Allen Downs, assistant professor of music.

The concert is open to the public at no charge.
