DULUTH--In a pre-U. N. Week address Friday (Oct.18), Illinois Senator Paul Douglas will analyze America's position on the world military and economic scene at 11 a.m. in UMD's Main auditorium.

Sponsored by the UMD division of social sciences, Senator Douglas' appearance is among a number arranged by the Minneapolis campus' department of concerts and lectures.

Open to the public free of charge, the convocation is expected to attract a large audience of area as well as Duluth residents.

Senator Douglas was professor of industrial relations at the University of Chicago when first elected to the U. S. Senate in 1947. He was re-elected in 1954.

Active member of the senate banking and currency and labor and public welfare committees, Senator Douglas has achieved prominence in monetary, credit and fiscal matters in the senate.

In an international competition, he received the \$5,000 prize for his book "The Theory of Wages." Senator Douglas has served numerous agencies as consultant and author of policy and program drafts, including the original social security act.
