

Teams from Wisconsin State college at Eau Claire, St. Cloud State college and Hibbing Junior college will compete in a UMD-sponsored quadrangular debate tournament beginning at 1 p.m. Friday (Dec.6) in Kirby Student center.

Coordinated by Richard Gottschald, Duluth, UMD speech major, the tournament will be conducted on the national debate question, "Resolved, That the requirement of membership in a labor organization as a condition of employment should be illegal.

Two former UMD speech department men will figure in the tourney.

Donald Sundquist, a 1955 UMD graduate who majored in speech and minored in music, will bring the Hibbing representation to the UMD campus. Sundquist appeared in 13 University Theatre productions and assisted in direction while at Duluth. He was active in other forensics work. He now is instructor of speech, debate coach and theatre director at HJC.

David <sup>E</sup>Walker, UMD lecturer in speech during the year 1955-56, is assisting in debate at Eau Claire. He or Miss Grace Walsh will accompany the Wisconsin group.

St. Cloud will send two pairs of teams and their coach, Oscar Ingram. Hibbing and Eau Claire will be represented by one pair of teams each.

Six UMD teams coached by Robert H. Haakenson are expected to compete. Affirmative teams will include Donald Peterson, Ray Anselment and Paul Kent, all of Duluth, Wesley Blasjo, Sturgeon Lake, James Bernard and Sherman Gonyea, both of Proctor.
