Duluth--- William Saltzman, one of Minnesota's most distinguished artists, will personally greet visitors to a retrospective exhibition of his works at UMD's Tweed Gallery Saturday night (Oct. 22).

The display spanning 30 years of Saltzman's painting and drawing will open at 8 p.m. Saturday for patrons and subscribers of the gallery and friends of the artist. The show continues through Nov. 20.

As many as 50 friends and collectors from the Twin Cities and Rochester will drive to Duluth by special bus to attend the opening. Many are private collectors who lent Saltzman works to UMD for the exhibit.

William G. Boyce, associate director of Tweed Gallery, said the 100 paintings and drawings represent the largest collection of Saltzman's works ever to be shown anywhere.

Saltzman, currently a visiting artist at Macalester College, St. Paul, is a native of Minneapolis. He was assistant and acting director of the University's gallery in Minneapolis for two years and resident artist and director of the Rochester, Minn. Art Center for six years. His many stained glass creations in churches and other public buildings are known nationally.

Nineteenth Century French paintings will be shown in the Alice Tweed Tuohy Room.
