PREREGISTRATION FOR SECONDARY TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM-----Preregistration for STEP has been scheduled for the week of February 26-March 2, in Ed 228, 9:00-12:00, 1:00-3:00. CHANGES IN REGISTRATION DATE FOR SPRING QUARTER 1973-----The schedule as published in the 1972-73 Class Schedule designates Wednesday, March 7, 1973, as Spring quarter registration for undergraduate students enrolled Winter quarter, and Wednesday, March 14, 1973, as Study Day.

The changes adopted by the UMD Administrative Committee will now designate officially Wednesday, March 7, as a regular class day, and Tuesday and Wednesday, March 13 and 14, as combination registration/Study Days.

Juniors and seniors who are currently enrolled Winter quarter will register for Spring quarter on Tuesday, March 13, while this day will be designated officially Study Day for freshmen and sophomores.

Freshmen and sophomores who are currently enrolled Winter quarter will register for Spring quarter on Wednesday, March 14, while this day will be designated officially Study Day for juniors and seniors. (D. Vose)

DULUTH CAMPUS ASSEMBLY MEETING-----The Duluth Campus Assembly will meet on Tuesday, March 6, at 2:30 p.m. in Room 200 Science Building.

SENATE MEETING-----A regular meeting of the University Senate will be held at 3:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 8, in Nicholson Auditorium, Minneapolis.

NEW LOCATION FOR MAIL BOXES-----New snorkel-type mail boxes have been placed at the entrance to Parking Lot A on Lawn Drive. These boxes will replace the ones formerly located at the Science Building entrance near the old greenhouse. The new location of the mail boxes should be more convenient and serve a greater number of people. (J. Johnson)

TRAVEL-----John Jones spent three weeks (December 20-January 10) in Japan, Korea and Taiwan visiting various national and international social welfare organizations, including the Ministry of Health and Welfare in Tokyo and the United Nations Development Program in Seoul. While in Taipei, he was a guest of a Guam legislator, Mr. C. F. Chou, who is engaged in legislation relating to Taiwan's higher education. Discussions (conducted in English, Japanese - through an interpreter - and Chinese) centered on education for social development, and the role of schools of social work in this regard. Again and again, those working in the field of development stressed the need for international cooperation in higher education.

APPOINTED-----Fred Schroeder has been appointed by the National American Studies Faculty to serve as a regular member of the Advisory Board to Museum Projects. His first meeting in this capacity was held at Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, in early December.....Stanley Thompson has been appointed an associate to the Language and Area Center for Latin America of the University of Wisconsin--Milwaukee for a one year term. As a selected associate member, he will be able to utilize the resources at the Center and also will serve as a consultant on Latin American studies.

COUNCIL ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY MEETING-----Dale Olsen attended the third meeting of the All-University Council on Environmental Quality in Minneapolis on February 6. The Council approved draft guidelines for support of experimental courses. Following this action, the Council voted to grant a request from UMD for \$600 for partial support of I. S. 3-100 - Man's Environment, His Future, which is offered here during Spring quarter.

The Council also voted to approve draft guidelines for the support of environmental research activities. Final implementation of this decision will occur at the next Council meeting in late February. The Environmental Council proposes a budget of \$70,000 for 1973-74.

TV PRESENTATIONS-----Bonnie Olesiak and Arvo Kallio appeared on Dick Anthony's "Scene Today" TV show on February 9 and presented a program on "Plant Propagation." Miss Olesiak is scheduled for two more appearances on the show in February. Her topic on February 16 will again be "Plant Propagation," and on February 23, she will be speaking on "Corsages." "Scene Today" is presented on WDSM from 9:00-9:30 a.m.

SPEECHES-----On January 29, Charles Matsch was the colloquium speaker for the Department of Soil Science, St. Paul campus. His topic was "Glacial Geology of Southwestern Minnesota." Earlier in January, Dr. Matsch spoke to an evening meeting of the Sandstone Audubon Society on "Minnesota's Glacier Heritage."
